Project Seniors provided hygiene items, small gifts and parties to under served seniors.

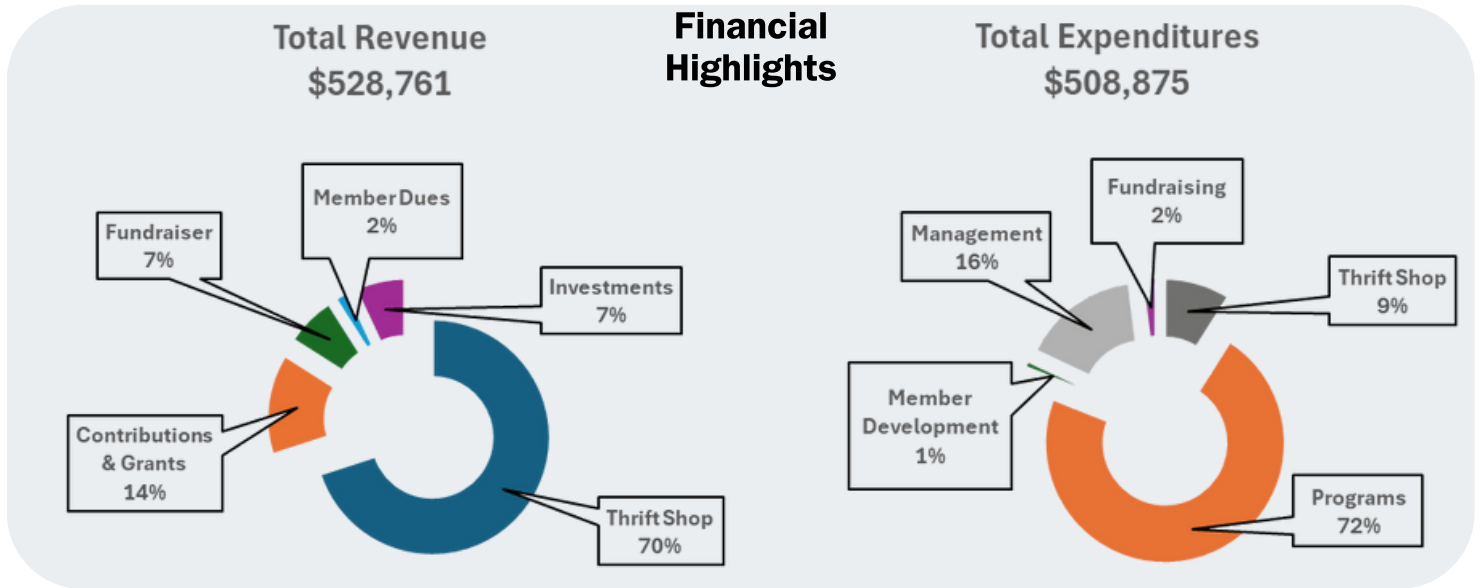
2024-25 ANNUAL REPORT SUMMARY
