

Assistive Technology (AT) is any type of device or service that increases, maintains, or improves the functional capabilities of individuals with disabilities. In other words, *AT does more than make difficult tasks easier, it makes seemingly impossible tasks possible*. UCP's AT services increase the independence and enhance the lives of Pennsylvanians of all ages--at home, school, work, and even at play.

UCP's Changing Hands* equipment reuse program provides restored and refurbished AT equipment to eligible individuals **free of charge**. A partial listing of the types of equipment and devices we have available on a regular basis includes, but is not limited to:

- walkers
- hooyer lifts
- bath seats and toilet seats
- transfer benches and transfer boards
- manual and power wheelchairs
- scooters
- daily living aids (items for eating, dressing, etc.)
- canes and crutches
- adapted telephones
- communication devices
- assistive listening devices
- blind/low vision aids
- adaptive games and recreational devices
