

A Great Day in the Kingdom – May 6, 2022

He explained that in almost every circumstance or environment in which he found himself, something or someone would evoke feelings of one or more of those events. As he continued to speak, I found myself understanding in a strange way. This guy even had a nickname! I had allowed the label to define him. At that moment, I was ashamed.

I would like to say that he was more pleasant to deal with after that Sunday. Well, he was not. I would like to say that Grace came easier from me. It did not come easier. What happened on that day was a change in my reaction. It reminds me of:

Ephesians 2:8-9, For by Grace you have saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast.

If God gives us the gift of Grace, aren't we called to discern and share it with the world? Where should you pray for an endless supply of Grace with folks who pose a challenge? The world is watching us, waiting to see if we are a people of Grace and Love.
