

A Great Day in the Kingdom – 3/31/23

Next week we come together to celebrate Holy Week, one of the most exciting times in Christiandom. It is something we Christians have celebrated for 2000 years. It is something we Christians have celebrated despite the politics of those anointed to lead.

When churches hold “open” meetings to voice opinions and vote, we have seen how it turns into shouting where people speak to drown out opposing views and no one can hear or wants to listen.

Aledo is not a small-town or county seat Church. Our Church family is respectful of varying viewpoints. Our theme at Aledo UMC encompasses Love and Respect for one another. Remember our invitation? “You won’t find a better group of people who are Sinners, just trying to get in right.” We have grown together in numerous ways, by following the guidance of God’s Holy Spirit.

Aledo UMC is made up of Conservatives, Liberals and Moderates, as we worship together in mutual respect. Again, in spite of what you may or may not have been told, no one can change who we are and how we are. If you like who we are now, nothing needs to change. There are many of you who seek clarity and ask Where do we stand? We stand together, with Jesus Christ! Glen Lake Camp has never turned away a child for lack of finances.
