The story of Noah is probably one of the most popular Old Testament stories universally known. Noah was not perfect, as a child of God, nor was he sinless. He however, was a righteous man, in a time when God was looking for someone who would be faithful, without question.

Can you imagine being on the receiving end of God's instruction to build an ark, as He was soon to flood the world?

Genesis 7:1 Then the Lord said to Noah, "Enter the ark, you and all your household, for you alone I have seen to be righteous before Me in this time."

We are all called to seek righteousness. As Wesleyan people, we call it the process of Sanctification. We seek God's will, through the power of His Holy Spirit.
