

# OH, HOLY NIGHT

## Reflections From the Pastor's Desk

“Oh, Holy Night” is one of my favorite advent hymns. It captures the beauty and magnificence of the expectation and waiting for the arrival of Jesus. I recall a particular moment in time that caught me offguard, as I heard the words “Fall on your knees, oh hear the angel’s voices.” These words filled me with shivers.

What would it have been like to be a shepherd in the field when the angels came? The first words out of the Angel’s mouth were “Fear Not!” At countless places in the bible, when angels appear, or people find themselves in the presence of God, they are filled with a reverent fear. This is a respect of God, an acknowledgment of the perfection of God, and our imperfect state.

In many places, the Bible recounts people falling prostrate before the Lord. Moses had to be told by God to stand up, so he could speak with him. Isaiah was cleansed by angels touching coals to his lips when he stood in the presence of the Lord in a dream.

When I hear this song, it reminds me of the Holy reverence with which we should approach Christmas. This is the time of year we remember the coming of our Lord in human form. While we often speak of God as love, or as our friend, do we give sufficient reverence to the Creator of all that is?

This Advent season, while we look forward to the great joy that is Christmas, lets also remember to approach God with great reverence. May we all fall on our knees as we hear the Angel’s voices, may we fully encounter the Lord. I pray each of you has an encounter with the Lord this season. May our encounters have such an impact that we all lie prostrate in a state of awe and wonder. Amen!




## ADVENT BIBLE STUDY CLASS:



**January 9, 2020:** Educated: A Memoir by Tara Westover (led by Barbara Kleinert)

An unforgettable memoir about a young girl who, kept out of school, leaves her survivalist family and goes on to earn a PhD from Cambridge University

Born to survivalists in the mountains of Idaho, Tara Westover was seventeen the first time she set foot in a classroom. Her family was so isolated from mainstream society that there was no one to ensure the children received an education, and no one to intervene when one of Tara's older brothers became violent. When another brother got himself into college, Tara decided to try a new kind of life. Her quest for knowledge transformed her, taking her over oceans and across continents, to Harvard and to Cambridge University. Only then would she wonder if she'd traveled too far, if there was still a way home.
