

South Florida Reports the Highest Statewide Annual Job Growth in the Trade, Transportation, and Utilities Industry

The Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO), Bureau of Labor Market Statistics reported that the unemployment rate in the CareerSource South Florida region (Miami-Dade and Monroe counties) was 2.3 percent in August 2022. This rate was 2.7 percentage points lower than the region's year ago rate of 5.0 percent. The region's August 2022 unemployment rate was 0.5 percentage point lower than the state rate of 2.8 percent. The labor force was 1,386,679, up 32,323 (+2.4 percent) over the year. There were 31,423 unemployed residents in the region.

Monroe County had the lowest unemployment rate (1.7 percent) in the CareerSource South Florida region followed by Miami-Dade County (2.3 percent).

Labor Market Analysis

- In July 2022, nonagricultural employment in the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD was 1,267,300, an increase of 80,400 jobs (+6.8 percent) over the year.
- The Manufacturing (+12.6 percent); Leisure and Hospitality (+12.4 percent); Other Services (+9.8 percent); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+8.9 percent); Professional and Business Services (+6.4 percent); Education and Health Services (+6.2 percent); Financial Activities (+5.7 percent); and Mining, Logging, and Construction (+4.2 percent) industries grew as fast or faster in the metro area than statewide over the year.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+26,200 jobs); Education and Health Services (+12,000 jobs); and Manufacturing (+5,100 jobs) industries.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Manufacturing (+12.6 percent) and Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+8.9 percent) industries.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the second highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Financial Activities (+4,900 jobs) and Mining, Logging, and Construction (+2,200 jobs) industries.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the second fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Financial Activities (+5.7 percent) industry.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year were Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+26,200 jobs); Leisure and Hospitality (+15,700 jobs); Education and Health Services (+12,000 jobs); Professional and Business Services (+11,900 jobs); Manufacturing (+5,100 jobs); Financial Activities (+4,900 jobs); Other Services (+4,600 jobs); and Mining, Logging, and Construction (+2,200 jobs).
