

South Florida Reports Job Growth Increase of 20,900 Jobs

According to the Florida Department of Commerce, Bureau of Labor Market Statistics, the unemployment rate in the CareerSource South Florida region (Miami-Dade County) was 2.7% in April 2025. This represents an increase of 0.4 percentage points compared to the April 2024 rate of 2.3%.

Despite the year-over-year increase, the region's unemployment rate remained 0.8 percentage points lower than the statewide rate of 3.5% for the same period.

The regional labor force totaled 1,440,900, reflecting a decrease of 1,707 workers (-0.1%) compared to the previous year. In April 2025, there were 38,382 unemployed residents in the CareerSource South Florida region.

Labor Market Analysis

In April 2025, nonagricultural employment in the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall Metropolitan Division totaled **1,356,200**, reflecting a gain of **20,900 jobs (+1.6%)** over the past year.

Several industries in the metro area experienced faster job growth than the state average, including:

- **Mining, Logging, and Construction** (+7.3%)
- **Trade, Transportation, and Utilities** (+2.4%)
- **Professional and Business Services** (+1.4%)
- **Financial Activities** (+0.5%)

Among all metro areas in Florida, the **Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall area** recorded the **highest annual job growth** in:

- **Trade, Transportation, and Utilities** (+7,700 jobs)
- **Mining, Logging, and Construction** (+4,300 jobs)
- **Professional and Business Services** (+2,900 jobs)

Additionally, it posted the **fastest job growth rate** in the **Mining, Logging, and Construction** sector, increasing by **7.3%**, the highest among all metropolitan areas statewide.

Industries that added jobs over the year include:

- **Trade, Transportation, and Utilities** (+7,700)
- **Education and Health Services** (+4,500)
- **Mining, Logging, and Construction** (+4,300)
- **Professional and Business Services** (+2,900)
- **Government** (+800)
- **Financial Activities** (+500)
- **Other Services** (+400)
- **Manufacturing** (+200)
