Several South Florida Industries Grew Faster Than They Did Statewide Over The Year

The Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO), Bureau of Labor Market Statistics reported that the unemployment rate in the CareerSource South Florida region (Miami-Dade and Monroe counties) was 1.5 percent in November 2022. This rate was 1.7 percentage points lower than the region's year ago rate of 3.2 percent. The region's November 2022 unemployment rate was 1.1 percentage points lower than the state rate of 2.6 percent. The labor force was 1,373,486, up 5,612 (+0.4 percent) over the year. There were 20,713 unemployed residents in the region.

Miami-Dade County had the lowest unemployment rate (1.5 percent) in the CareerSource South Florida region followed by Monroe County (1.6 percent).

In November 2022, nonagricultural employment in the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD was 1,284,300, an increase of 58,800 jobs (+4.8 percent) over the year.

Labor Market Analysis

- The Manufacturing (+11.7 percent); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+6.6 percent); Education and Health Services (+6.2 percent); Financial Activities (+5.3 percent); and Professional and Business Services (+3.1 percent) industries grew faster in the metro area than statewide over the year.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+20,200 jobs); Education and Health Services (+12,100 jobs); and Financial Activities (+4,600 jobs) industries.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Manufacturing (+11.7 percent) industry.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the second highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Manufacturing (+4,900 jobs) industry.
- The Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD had the second fastest annual job growth rate compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+6.6 percent) industry.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year were Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+20,200 jobs); Education and Health Services (+12,100 jobs); Leisure and Hospitality (+9,900 jobs); Professional and Business Services (+6,000 jobs); Manufacturing (+4,900 jobs); Financial Activities (+4,600 jobs); Other Services (+2,900 jobs); and Mining, Logging, and Construction (+900 jobs).
