According to the Florida Department of Commerce, Bureau of Labor Market Statistics, the unemployment rate in the CareerSource South Florida region (Miami-Dade County) was 2.8 percent in July 2025. The region's August 2025 unemployment rate was 1.5 percentage points lower than the state rate of 4.4 percent. The labor force was 1,446,713, with no change over the year. There were 42,078 unemployed residents in the region.

Labor Market Analysis

In **August 2025**, nonagricultural employment in the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD was **1,345,200**, an increase of **16,100 jobs** (+1.2 percent) over the year.

Industries in the metro area experienced faster job growth than the state average include:

- Mining, Logging, and Construction (+6.3%)
- Education and Health Services (+2.8%)
- Financial Activities (+2.5%)
- Trade, Transportation, & Utilities (+1.8%)

Among all metro areas in Florida, the **Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall area** recorded the **highest annual job growth** in:

- Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+5,700 jobs)
- Mining, Logging, and Construction (+3,800 jobs)
- Financial Activities (+2,400 jobs)

Additionally, it posted the **fastest annual job growth rate** in the **Trade**, **Transportation**, **and Utilities** industry, increasing by **1.8%**, the highest among all metropolitan areas statewide.

Industries that added jobs over the year include:

- Education and Health Services (+6,100 jobs)
- Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+5,700 jobs)
- Mining, Logging, and Construction (+3,800 jobs)
- Financial Activities (+2,400 jobs)
- Other Services (+500 jobs)
- Government (+300 jobs)
