According to the Florida Department of Commerce, Bureau of Labor Market Statistics, the unemployment rate in the CareerSource South Florida region (Miami-Dade County) was 2.4 percent in June 2025. This rate was 0.2 percentage point lower than the region's year ago rate of 2.6 percent. The region's June 2025 unemployment rate was 1.5 percentage points lower than the state rate of 3.9 percent. The labor force was 1,439,567, down 1,765 (-0.1 percent) over the year. There were 35,146 unemployed residents in the region.

Labor Market Analysis

In **June 2025**, nonagricultural employment in the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD was **1,335,200**, an increase of **20,300 jobs** (+1.5 percent) over the year.

Several industries in the metro area experienced faster job growth than the state average, including:

- Mining, Logging, and Construction (+8.1%)
- Trade, Transportation, & Utilities (+2.0%)
- Professional and Business Services (+1.1%)
- Financial Activities (+0.1%)

Among all metro areas in Florida, the **Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall area** recorded the **highest annual job growth** in:

- Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+6,300 jobs)
- Mining, Logging, and Construction (+4,800 jobs)

Additionally, it posted the **fastest annual job growth rate** in the **Mining, Logging, and Construction** sector, increasing by **8.1%**, the highest among all metropolitan areas statewide.

- Education and Health Services (+5,600 jobs)
