

## RESIDENT ELIGIBILITY

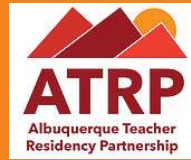
Candidates for ATRP must:

- Qualify for admission to the UNM COE Graduate Program.
- Seek a teaching license in Elementary or Secondary Education.
  - Hold a Bachelor's Degree
  - Pass Test of Essential Academic Skills\*
  - Have a minimum 3.0 GPA
  - Be able to pass a background check
  - Be legally authorized to work in the U.S.

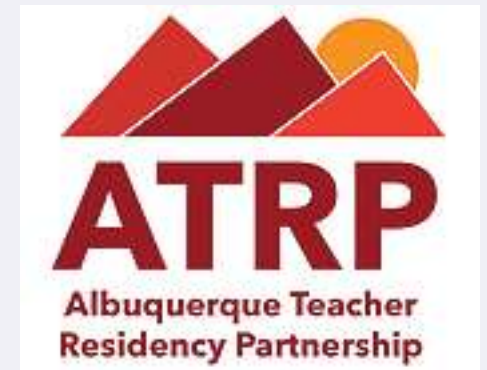

As a Resident, you will:

- Complete graduate coursework in either the Elementary Education Program (grades K-8) or the Secondary Education Program (grades 7-12),
- Complete a yearlong fulltime residency field experience in an APS Community School,
- Receive a stipend of \$15,000 to offset living expenses while teaching full time in K-12,
- Receive support from New Mexico Workforce Connection to assist with funds for tuition and books,
- Be coached and mentored by an APS Master Teacher,
- Earn a New Mexico Teaching License, and
- Agree to teach in APS for 2 years following successful completion of ATRP.

The Albuquerque Teacher Residency Partnership was created by the College of Education at the University of New Mexico, the Albuquerque Public Schools, and the Albuquerque Teachers Federation.
