

Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP) Review





CFAP Purpose

CFAP provides direct assistance to agricultural producers impacted by the effects of the COVID-19 outbreak.

The objective of CFAP is to provide direct payments to producers who have been impacted by COVID-19 resulting in:

- actual losses for agricultural producers where prices and market supply chains have been impacted
- lost demand and short-term oversupply for the 2020 marketing year.



CFAP Commodities

The commodities currently included in the program are those for which USDA data was available to determine that a five percent-orgreater price decline occurred from mid-January 2020 to mid-April 2020.

Commodities that did not suffer a five percent-or-greater price decline from mid-January 2020 to mid-April 2020 are not eligible for CFAP.



CFAP Funding

Two Funding Sources:

- CARES Act provides
 - \$ 9.5 Billion
- CCC Charter Act provides
 - \$ 6.5 billion



Eligible Producers

(1-CFAP Paragraph 15)

To be <u>eligible</u> for a CFAP payment, a producer must have had a share in the eligible commodity on January 15, 2020; (or April 16th through May 14th, 2020 for livestock inventory). In addition the producer must be a:

- Citizen or National of the United States
- Resident alien (possessing a Resident Alien Card (I-551)
- Partnership of citizens or nationals of the United States
- Corporation, Limited Liability Company, or other organizational structure organized under State law
- Indian Tribe or Tribal organization, as defined in section 4(b) of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. 5304); or
- Foreign Person or Foreign Entity who meets Foreign Person Rules according to 5-PL



Forms

The following forms are applicable to CFAP:

- AD-3114, CFAP Application
- CCC-902, Farm Operating Plan for Payment Eligibility
- CCC-901, Member Information for Legal Entities, if applicable
- CCC-941, Average Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) Certification
- **CCC-942**, Certification of Income Farming, Ranching, and Forestry Operations", *optional*
- AD-1026, HELC & WC Certification
- **CCC-860,** SDA/LR/Beginning and Veteran Farmer or Rancher Certification, *optional for demographics reporting only*

FSA-578, Report of Acreage, is **NOT** required for CFAP!



Eligibility Forms

IMPORTANT

- All producer eligibility forms related to CFAP <u>MUST</u> be filed within 60-days from the date of signing the CFAP application.
- Failure to timely provide all eligibility forms will result in no payment or a reduced payment.



Producer Reporting Requirements

The information required from producers to participate in CFAP will be a <u>self-certification</u> by the producer or authorized representative.

Producers self-certify to their losses but should have documentation available.

All self-certifications are subject to spot check and COC may request documentation if certifications are questioned



Applications

Producers will submit ONE application form for their entire operation by the deadline of September 11, 2020

Revised applications may be submitted by application deadline.

PART A - PRODUCER AGREEMENT

The Department of Agriculture (USDA) will make payments under the CFAP to producers who meet the requirements of the program. The following information is needed in order for USDA to make a determination that the applicant is eligible to receive a CFAP payment. By submitting this application, and upon approval by USDA, the applicant agrees:

- To comply with regulations set forth in 7 CFR Part 9 and any Notice of Funds Availability published by USDA. Copies of these documents may be found at www.regulations.gov/docket70=FSA-2020-0004.
- That a CFAP payment will only be made with respect to a commodity produced in the United States and Intended to be marketed for commercial production;
- Nonspecialty crop and wool inventory and livestock sales between January 15, 2020 and April 15, 2020, must be unpriced as of January 15, 2020. Specialty crops
 that were sold between January 15, 2020, and April 15, 2020 under an agreed upon set price before January 15, 2020, do not qualify for assistance.
- To provide to USDA all information that is necessary to verify that the information provided on this form is accurate and to allow USDA representative access to all documents and records of the producer, including those in the possession of a third-party such as a warehouse operator, processor or packer;
- 5. To comply with maximum payment limitation and adjusted gross income provisions applicable to the CFAP by completing forms:
 - CCC-902, Farm Operating Plan for Payment Eligibility (NOTE: Only Parts A and B of the form are required).

 The applicant only has an interest in land devoted to the production of agricultural commodities that are perennial crops, excluding sugar cane, such as

If the applicant produces airfaifs, the applicant must contact the Natural Resources Conservation Service to determine if such production qualifies as the production of a perennial crop; and

Payments

Payments will be based on:

- Specific payment rates by commodity
- 100% of the calculated payment*

*subject to payment limitation



- \$250,000 payment limitation per person or legal entity.
- \$250,000 per member of joint operation or partnership.
- Option for LLCs, LPs and Corporations to add up to two additional limitations when members provide more than 400 hours of labor or management
 - The maximum limitation for a corporation, LLC, or LP may receive is \$750,000



The following table provides qualifying requirements for the optional increase in payment limitation.

IF	THEN the corporation's, LLC's, or LP's Payment Limitation is
none of the members, stockholders, or partners provide labor, management, or combination thereof	\$250,000.
1 person holding an ownership interest in the organizational structure provides at least 400 hours of active personal labor or active personal management or combination thereof	\$250,000.
2 persons holding an ownership interest in the organizational structure provides at least 400 hours of active personal labor or active personal management or combination thereof	\$500,000.
3 persons holding an ownership interest in the organizational structure provides at least 400 hours of active personal labor or active personal management or combination thereof	\$750,000.

PART H - INCREASED PAYMENT LIMITATION FOR CORPORATIONS, LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANIES AND LIMITED PARTNERSHIPS

38. Applicants who are Corporations, Limited Liability Companies, and Limited Partnerships may seek an increase in the per-person payment limitation from \$250,000 to either \$500,000, if such entity has two members, partners, or stockholders who each provided at least 400 hours or more of personal labor or active personal management, or combination thereof, to the farming operation as defined in 7 CFR Part 1400, or a maximum of \$750,000 if such entity has three members, partners, or stockholders who each provided at least 400 hours or more of personal labor or active personal management, or combination thereof, to the farming operation as defined in 7 CFR Part 1400. Identify the names of members, partners, or stockholders who provided at least 400 hours of active personal labor or active personal management, or combination thereof, to the farming operation identified in Part B Item 5:

Optional Increase in Payment Limitation Example:

LLC comprised of 2 members sharing 70% - 30%. Both certify to contributing over 400hrs of labor and/or management in Park H. CFAP losses total \$800,000:

- LLC payment limitation is increased to \$500k
 - Member A 70% x \$500k = attributed \$350k <u>limited to \$250k</u>
 - Member B -30% x \$500k = attributed \$150k

Net payment to the LLC is limited to \$400,000 (\$250k + \$150k)



Adjusted Gross Income Limitation

To be eligible for payment, a person or legal entity (including members, stockholders or partners of the legal entity) must have an average AGI for program year 2020 that does not exceed the \$900,000 limitation, unless, at least 75 percent of the person's or legal entity's average AGI is derived from farming, ranching or forestry operations.

The 3 base years used to compute the average AGI and Farm AGI are 2016, 2017, and 2018.

Applicants exceeding the \$900,000 limitation may complete form CCC-942 and obtain a certification from a licensed CPA or attorney verifying that 75 percent of the AGI is derived from farming, ranching or forestry operations.

Nursery





Definitions

Nursery - decorative or nondecorative plants grown in a container or controlled environment for commercial sale.

Floriculture - cut flowers and cut greenery from annual and perennial flowering plants grown in a container or controlled environment for commercial sale.



Controlled Environment

Controlled environment...an environment in which everything that can practicably be controlled with structures, facilities, growing media (including but not limited to water, soil, or nutrients) by the producer, that is in fact controlled by the producer, as determined by industry standards.



Eligible Categories

1) Inventory that shipped but was spoiled or unpaid between January 15, 2020, and April 15, 2020 (CARES ACT)

2) Inventory not sold between January 15, 2020 and April 15, 2020 (and will never be sold) (CCC Funds)



Inventory Shipped but Subsequently Spoiled /Unpaid

Eligible Inventory:

- the **wholesale value** of commodities that were shipped (delivered) between January 15, 2020, and April 15, 2020,
- no payment was received or will be received.

Ineligible Inventory:

Sold after April 15, 2020



Inventory That Was Never Sold and Subsequently Destroyed

Eligible Inventory:

- shipments that did not leave the farm,
- donated, or
- inventory destroyed (not delivered)
- the wholesale value of inventories not shipped as of April 15, 2020 are eligible.

Ineligible Inventory:

- in storage that may be sold after April 15, 2020
- that is normally culled in advance of shipping or upon delivery are not eligible
- sold at a discount price



Payment Rates

Delivered and Unpaid:

• inventory that was shipped but subsequently spoiled or unpaid is **15.55** % (CARES Act)

Not Delivered

• inventory that was never sold is 13.45% (CCC)

Payment Formula:

wholesale value of inventory **X** payment rate

COC Review

Before approving CFAP application

- COC may request additional documentation:
 - verify ownership interest
 - quantity of the applicable commodity
 - verify value is wholesale

COC Use Only

COC may adjust "Volume of Inventory Sold" or "Volume Available Inventory"

- quantity is determined to be unreasonable or inaccurate
- reflect actual wholesale rather than retail value
