Your children have learned and grown so much during their year in Kindergarten, and we are so excited for them to join us in first grade! To continue to grow as learners over the summer months, we are sending home a calendar filled with activities to keep their brains busy through the relaxing summer months.

We kindly ask that your child completes as many activities from the calendar as they can throughout the summer. They can choose any activities in the calendar- it does not have to be in any special order. Skip around from top row to bottom row and left to right!

Students should complete a recording sheet after finishing an activity, however, some activities do not require a written response. Please feel free to make copies of the attached recording sheet or use lined paper to complete the responses which will be turned in on the first day of school.

In addition to completing activities from the calendar to refresh Language Arts and Math skills, we highly recommend that each student continues to practice reading daily, in addition to completing 10 minutes a day on the program, IXL ([www.ixl.com](http://www.ixl.com)). Your child's username for the IXL program is the first name followed by the first initial of their last name and the number 32 with no spaces in between (example: johnd32). Each user's password is **math**.

Write a sentence and draw a picture of what you see outside.	<b>Geometry</b>  Name and draw the shapes: 	<b>Non-Fiction Reading</b>  Read a non-fiction book. Write a fact that you learned.	<b>Shape Walk</b>  Take a walk around your neighborhood. Write all the different shapes you see.
<b>Beginning, Middle, and End</b>  Read your favorite story. Retell what happened and write 3 sentences using the words First, Next, and Last.	<b>Practice Doubles</b>  Write your doubles facts for the numbers 1 through 10.	<b>Be Creative!</b>  Build something from blocks or Legos. Draw a picture of your creation and write a sentence about what you made.	<b>Measuring Size</b>  Find 5 different sized items. Order the items from biggest to smallest. Write a list of the items from biggest to smallest.	<b>Future First Grader</b>  What do you think your first day of first grade will be like? How will you feel? Write 2 sentences about it.
