GRAND RE-OPENING of KANSAS WILDLIFE EXHIBIT

April 8 at 2:00pm

The Friends of the Kansas Wildlife Exhibit, a volunteer group through the Wichita Parks Foundation, invites you to a Grand Re-Opening of the exhibit Sunday, April 8 to celebrate the renovations made to the facility. Festivities will begin at 2:05 pm with opening remarks from District 6 representative, Cindy Claycomb followed by Janet Miller, previous council rep. There will be a behind the scenes tour of the exhibit and an educational program of the animals conducted by Great Plains Nature.

The Friends of the Kansas Wildlife Exhibit formed to improve this exhibit and to ensure that it remains viable and a learning experience about native Kansas animals. These animals are also used in educational outreach through the Great Plains Nature Center.

Because of generous donations, in just under 3 years significant improvements have been made on the Ks Wildlife Exhibit (AKA "The Little Zoo in Riverside Park"). Join us April 8th as we celebrate this wonderful Wichita amenity.

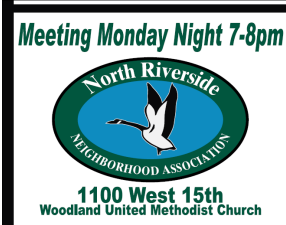

1. Spend one hour today picking up litter. Or decide that every time you see a piece of litter, you'll pick it up and throw it away.
2. If you see someone littering, politely ask them to pick it up. Or pick it up yourself and maybe the person who dropped it will see you and get the hint.
3. Organize a team of neighbors, friends, co-workers, or fellow church members to pick up litter in a specific neighborhood for an hour. Bring rubber gloves & garbage bags. Make it more fun by turning the clean-up into a game/contest.
4. Enjoy making a difference, getting exercise, getting to know people better, and having cleaner surroundings.

FACTS 250 million tons of trash is generated each year in the U.S.

- 4.6 pounds of waste is created every day by the average person.
- Common litter includes cigarette butts, plastic bags, paper, candy wrappers, fast-food packaging, bottle caps, 6-pack can holders, glass bottles, and plastic straws.
- Men and women are equally likely to litter.
- People under age 15 are least likely to litter; people under the age of 25 are most likely to litter when in a group; and, people over the age of 25 are most likely to litter when alone.
- In one single day, nearly 7 million pounds of litter were removed from beaches, lakes, and streams.
- Animals from nearly 443 species are entangled in or ingest marine debris annually. The majority of these die from starvation, exhaustion, or infection.
- People litter because: there is a presence of other litter; it's the easiest way to get rid of unwanted things; they think littering is acceptable because they pay taxes to have someone else pick it up; dumping is a social activity we learned from our parents and passed on unconsciously to our children.

With spring's imminent arrival comes that oft dreaded phrase, "Spring Cleaning". It seems like there is always so much more cleaning to do than at any other time of year. Yard, closets, basement, cabinets, and so on. All well and good, but don't overlook your vehicle. It's time to wash off all that winter muck, or more likely dust in this dry year. It might be a little chilly to do it in your driveway yet, but there are a couple of nice car wash services within our reach, probably more than a couple. Indian Hills Car Wash, just west of 13th and St. Paul, has been remodeled and sports several clean bays with power hoses and options for various spray cleaners and waxes etc. There is also an automatic drive-in wash, called Laserwash, with several options as well. The nice voice inside the automated payment machine asks you to insert payment in such a lovely way. She would be hard to refuse. The sign out front tells you to go to Sudsy Bucket Carwash on Facebook for deals.

Joe's Seat Cover and Car Wash, one at 206 N Seneca and the other at 308 N West Street, offer packages for you to choose from, ranging from \$19.95 to \$27.95. But go on Tuesday or Wednesday because they are half price days. You can watch your car go through the automated wash as it progresses through the process or go on into the waiting room and grab a drink and popcorn while you wait. Your car will be hand dried with the insides being wiped down as well. and while you wait, pick up a punch card. Get nine punches and your tenth wash is free.

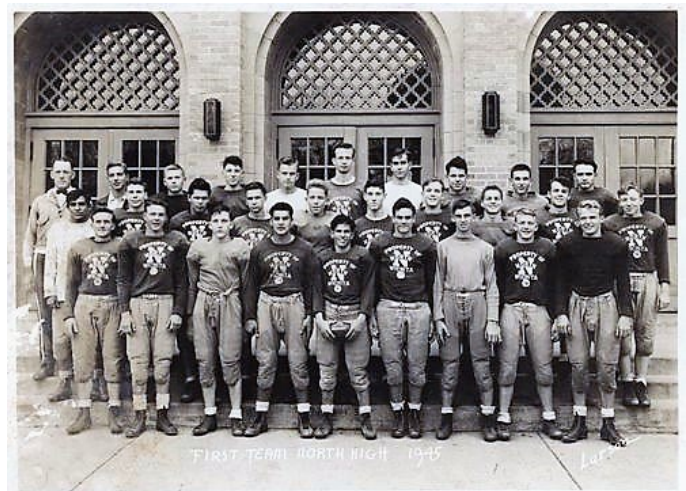

FRESH AIR BABY CAMP-GIRL SCOUT LITTLE HOUSE

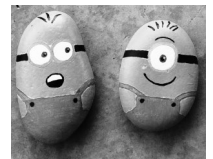
Work on the interior of this historic building is progressing! We now have beautifully polished concrete floors, thanks to First Con, Inc./Heck's Lawn Care, who donated almost three weeks of labor. Frederick Restoration has donated application of the floor caulking. Our new wiring and lighting is almost complete, thanks to a partnership between IBEW 271, our local electrical union, and Total Electric. Members of Sheet Metal Union, Local 29, have also joined our project, securing donated materials and fabricating needed adaptors for lighting fixtures and copper end caps for our dragon tongue rafter tails.

Our volunteers continue spending long hours finishing the original triple hung windows and staining the oak trip for windows and doors. Workers at the Baby Camp now enjoy good lighting, a working heat and cooling system, and electric outlets that limit the need for running extension cords. We have a finished ceiling and painted walls and soon window frames secured and insulated. We will then be moving outside-weather permitting. Watch for exterior stucco cleaning and progress on the windows! We are working on obtaining more funding and recruiting more volunteers. We offer on-the-job training!
