Bootanica at Botanica

Botanica's biggest family-friendly event, BOOtanica is approaching quickly. October 13th, 2018, from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., the entire garden will be transformed into different stations with activities for children of all ages. This event is a fundraiser for Botanica. Admission is \$9 per person (\$6 members), children under 2 are free. Feel free to come in costume or come as you are.

Games, arts and live animals are the kinds of things families can expect from BOOtanica. Some returning activities include the fortune teller, the Bug Lady, Exploration Place; Paint the Towne, live performances, mad scientist, owls, theater thrills, spider stop, fairies, gnomes, seed stop, bounce house, face painting, dancing, scavenger hunt, pumpkin patch and bee man.

Jack O'lantern Spectacular

Get in the Halloween spirit and come to Botanica's first ever Jack O'lantern Spectacular on October 10th, 11th and 12th from 6-9 p.m. Enjoy everything there is to love about fall, while strolling through the gardens for three fun-filled nights. Throughout the gardens will be around 500 uniquely carved pumpkins lit up for everyone to see, which have been carved by volunteer groups and individuals in the Wichita community. Enjoy live music, local craft beer from some of your favorite breweries and food for purchase from local restaurants and food trucks. Tickets are \$9 for non-members and \$6 for members.

Night of the Living Zoo

Bring your ghouls and goblins for a night of not-too-scary Halloween fun at the Sedgwick County Zoo October 26, 27, and 28, 2018, from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. Several ghoulish activities, like pumpkin bowling and beanbag tosses, can be found throughout the Zoo. Wear your costumes if you *dare* and take a stroll down jack-o'-lantern lane, creep up to candy stations and let your spirit come alive! You can wander the Zoo at your leisure, visiting Dracula and the fortune tellers, playing fun Halloween games, seeing creepy displays, and visiting Candy Land on your way out. Tickets in advance are \$7 and at the gate are \$9 for nonmembers and \$7 for members. Children two and under do not need a ticket.

A Night of Hay, Hooves and Halloween

Come out to Old Cowtown Museum for "A Night of Hay, Hooves and Halloween" from 2 to 8 p.m. October 27 and 28. There's no place spookier than Cowtown during Halloween. The Headless Horseman rides the streets, ghosts haunt the historic houses, and there's candy! \$5 per person.

Big Read Wichita Returns In 2018

The Big Read Wichita is returning for its 11th year, featuring the book *Station Eleven*, a science fiction novel by Emily St. John Mandel. *Station Eleven* won the prestigious Arthur C. Clarke Award in 2015 and was a finalist for the National Book Award and the PEN/Faulkner Award. Since its original publication in 2014, the book has been translated into 27 languages.

The Big Read Wichita runs from October 1 to November 15, with a special kickoff event hosted at the Advanced Learning Library on Saturday, September 29. Mayor Jeff Longwell and Congressional spouse Susan O. Estes will serve as honorary co-chairs for the program.

Stearman Field 6th Annual Pumpkin Drop/Halloween Bash

Pumpkin drop starts at 2 p.m. October 20. Bring your lawn chairs and blankets. Watch airplanes drop pumpkins from their planes onto the target below. Kids costume contest during pumpkin drop, approximately 3:30 p.m. Music that evening 7 p.m.-11 p.m. Adult costume contest during the evening. Look for the beer garden and concession stand outside. No coolers allowed.

Free Flight For Youth

For the past 25 years the EAA Young Eagles program has been giving children ages 8-17 the opportunity to fly for free. The flight experience will last approximately 20 minutes. Before the flight begins, the pilot will explain what will happen during the flight. He or she may also talk about the airplane, review an aeronautical chart (map), and complete a careful "walk-around" preflight inspection of the airplane. The pilot will also explain the interior of the plane including the instrument panel and safety belts. Once in the air, the child may even have the opportunity to take the controls for a little bit! Once back on the ground, the child will be able to ask the pilot more questions about flying and the airplane itself. They will also receive an official Young Eagles logbook with a personal code to activate a free EAA Student Membership and Sporty's Learn to Fly Course.

Free Girls In Aviation Day

Saturday, October 13, from 9 a.m. - noon up to 100 girls ages 8-16 will have the opportunity to learn all about aviation. This is a FREE Women in Aviation International Event. It is open to the first 100 girls who register.

Girls will have the chance to meet women with careers in aviation, learn about airport jobs, learn how to talk like a pilot and check out different types of planes. Fall Exhibit Opening At Wichita Art Museum

The Wichita Art Museum will open its fall exhibition, Kansas Land, with a special opening reception.

The exhibition will be on display through March 10, 2019. It features the recent work of two photographers – Larry Schwarm and Bryon Darby, who each worked in collaboration with a team of researchers – showing what Kansas farm life looks like in 2018 – from the fifth-generation farmer whose land has been passed down over generations to the first-generation sustainable farmer.

The opening party will be held Saturday, September 29 from 7-9 p.m. at the museum and will feature live music from The Haymakers. Photographers and university researchers will join attendees for a lively gathering. Admission to the Kansas Land opening party is \$10 for non-members and is free for WAM members.

Free Day At The Indian Center
