Methodology

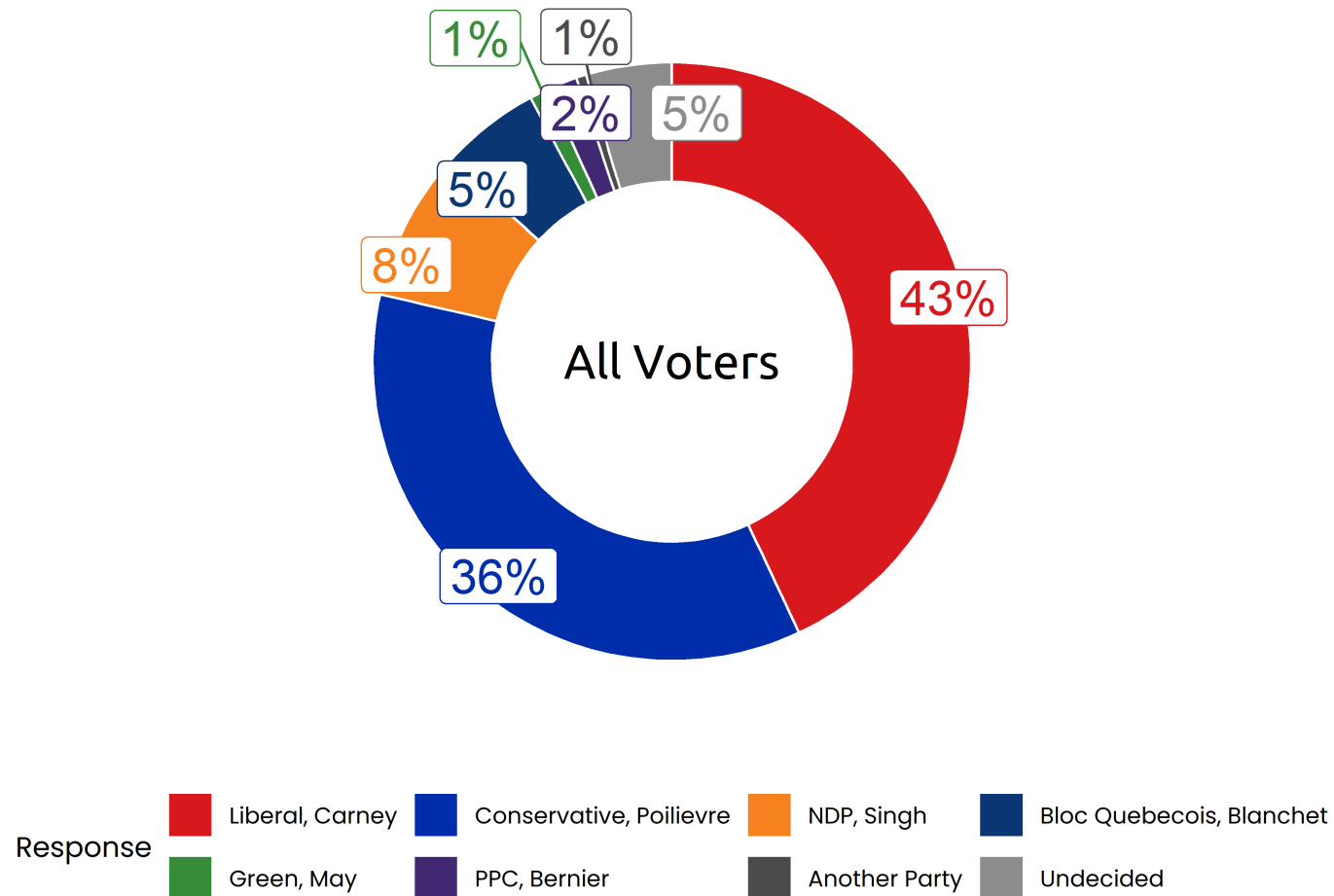
The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted on April 12th, 2025 among a sample of 1282 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Canada and are eligible to vote in federal elections. The survey was conducted using automated telephone interviews using Interactive Voice Recording technology (IVR). Respondents were interviewed on landlines and cellular phones. The sample was weighted by age, gender, and region according to the 2021 Census. The survey is intended to represent the adult population in Canada.

The margin of error for the poll is $\pm 2.7\%$, at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample.

Totals may not add up to 100% due to rounding.

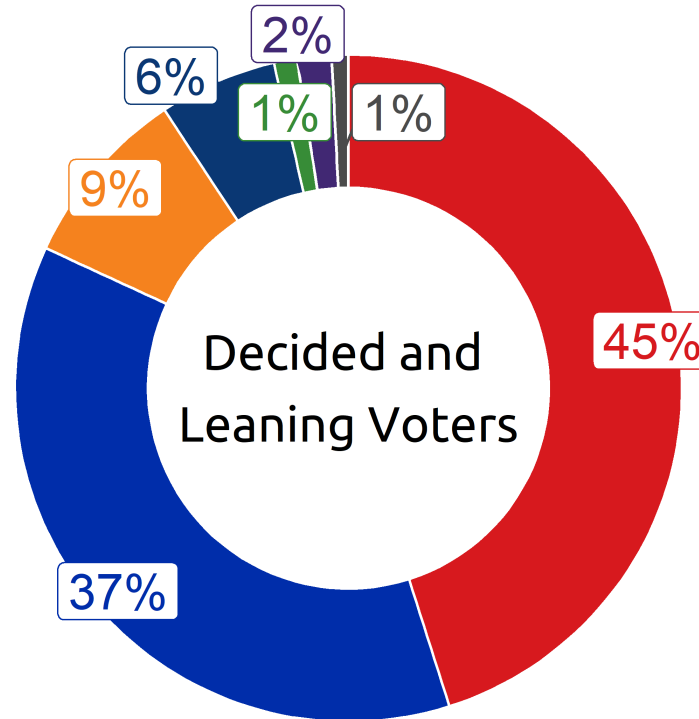
Federal Voting Intentions

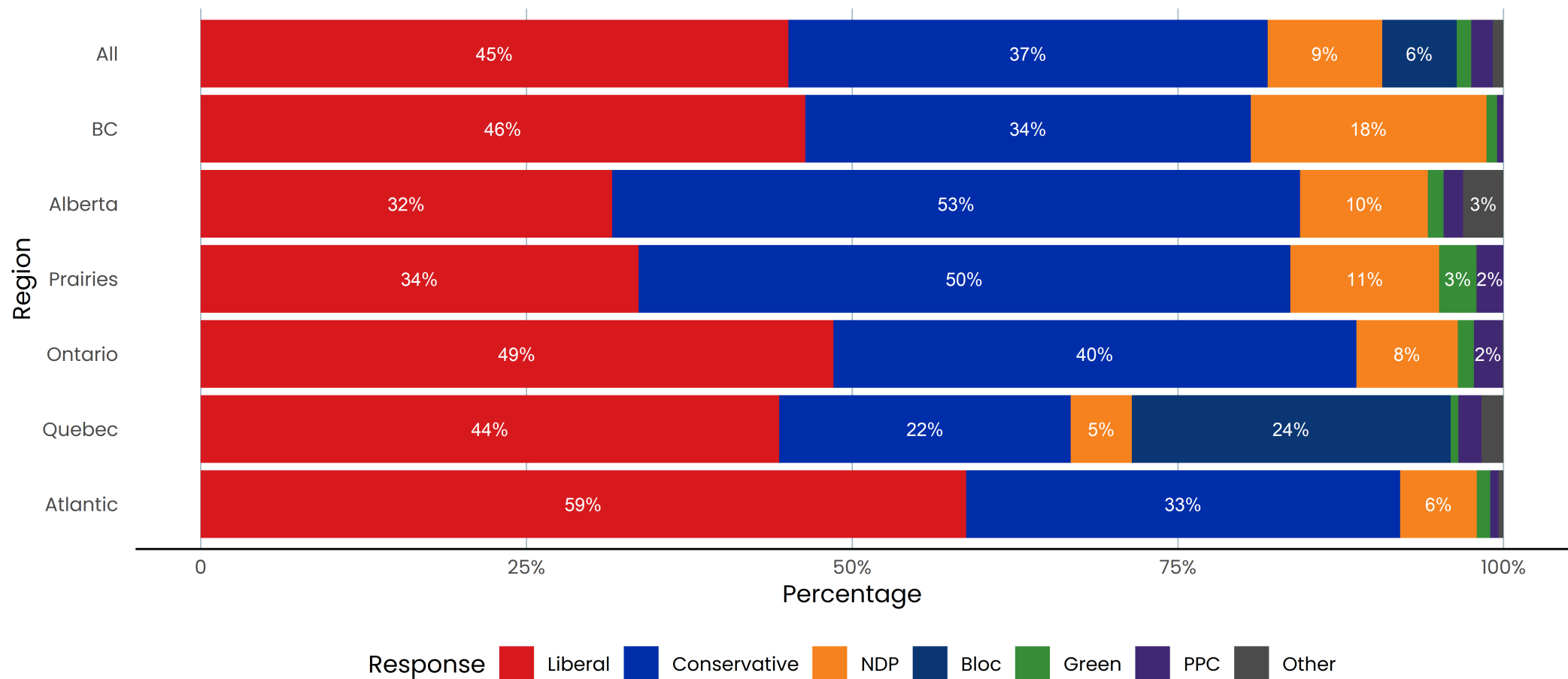

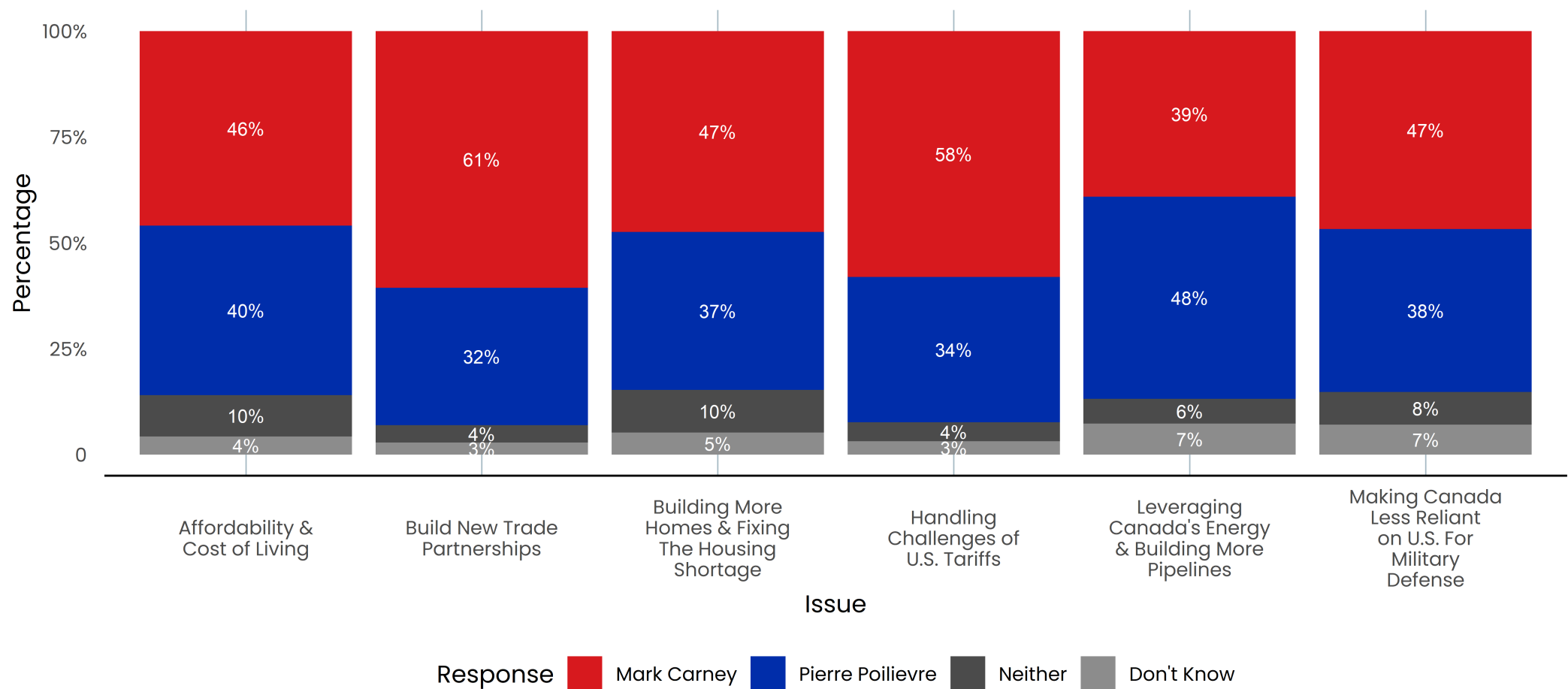

Carney v. Poilievre: Round 2

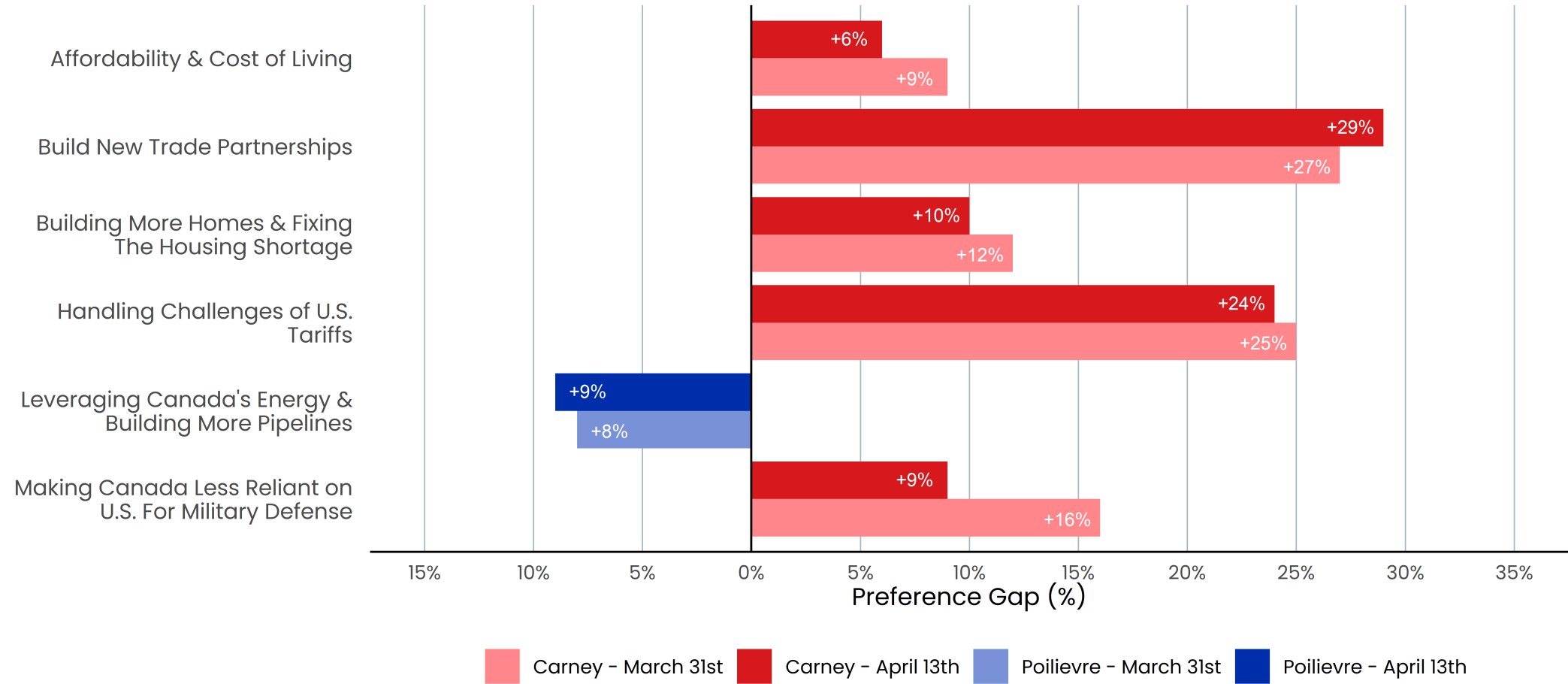
Who do you prefer to handle important issues and challenges currently facing Canada:

Carney vs Poilievre: Issue Preference Gap

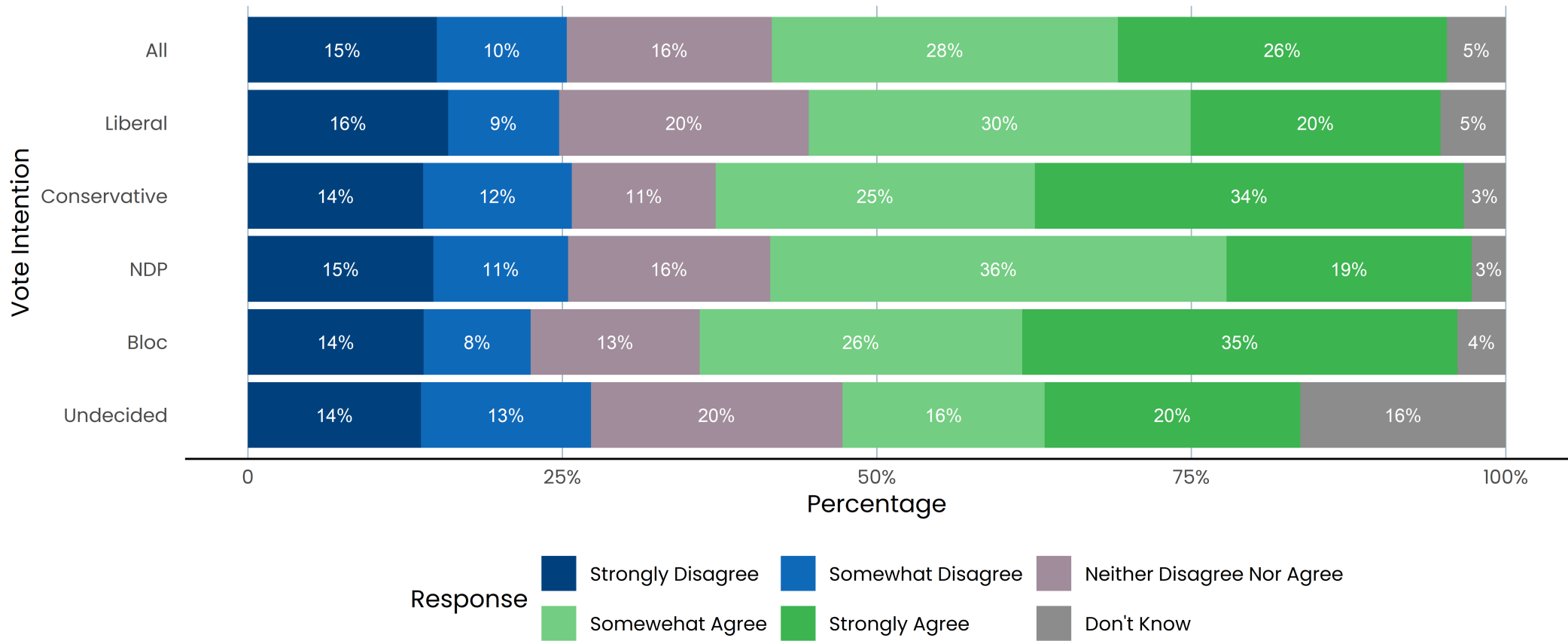
Left values indicate Poilievre is preferred, Right values indicate Carney is preferred
