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Methodology


The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted on February 12th-27th, 2026 among a sample of 1256 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in British Columbia and are eligible to vote in provincial elections. The survey was conducted using automated telephone interviews using Interactive Voice Recording technology (IVR). Respondents were interviewed on landlines and cellular phones. The sample was weighted by age, gender, and region according to the 2021 Census. The survey is intended to represent the adult population in British Columbia.

The margin of error for the poll is $\pm 2.8\%$, at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample.

Totals may not add up to 100% due to rounding.


If a BC provincial election were held tomorrow, which of the following parties would you vote for?




Preferred BC Conservative Leadership Candidates


Have you seen, read, or heard anything about the British Columbia provincial budget that was released earlier this month?
