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Methodology

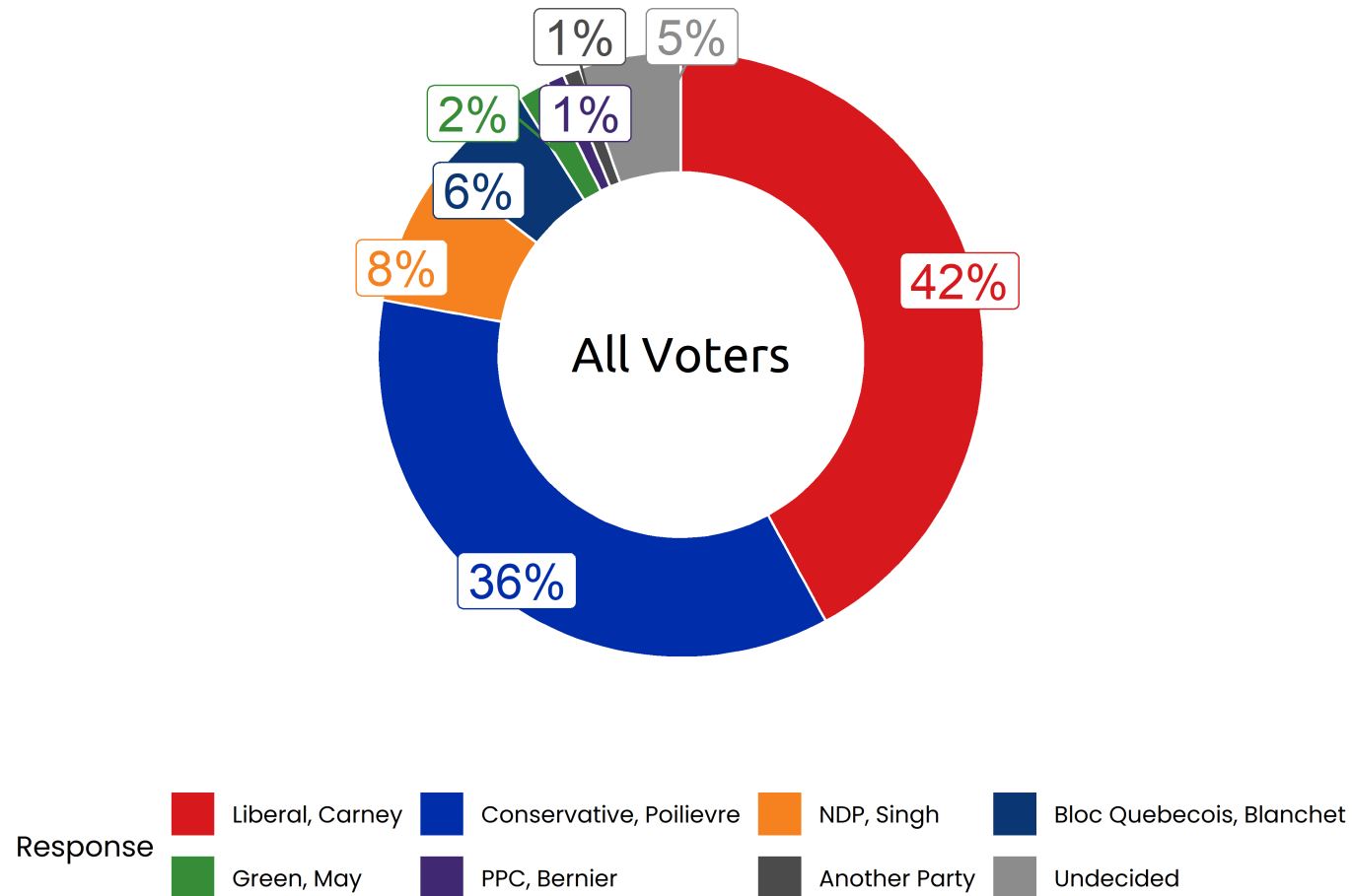
The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted on April 5th, 2025 among a sample of 1320 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Canada and are eligible to vote in federal elections. The survey was conducted using automated telephone interviews using Interactive Voice Recording technology (IVR). Respondents were interviewed on landlines and cellular phones. The sample was weighted by age, gender, and region according to the 2021 Census. The survey is intended to represent the adult population in Canada.

The margin of error for the poll is $\pm 2.7\%$, at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample.

Totals may not add up to 100% due to rounding.

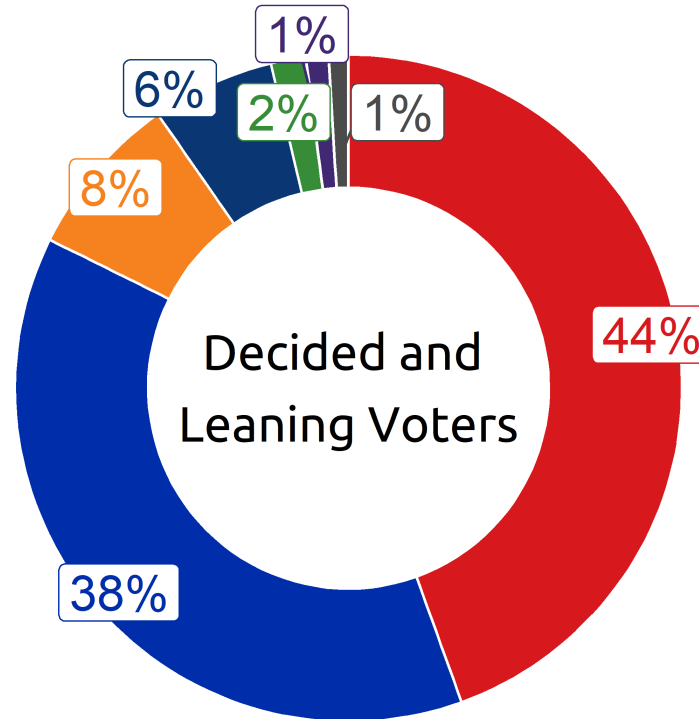
Federal Voting Intentions

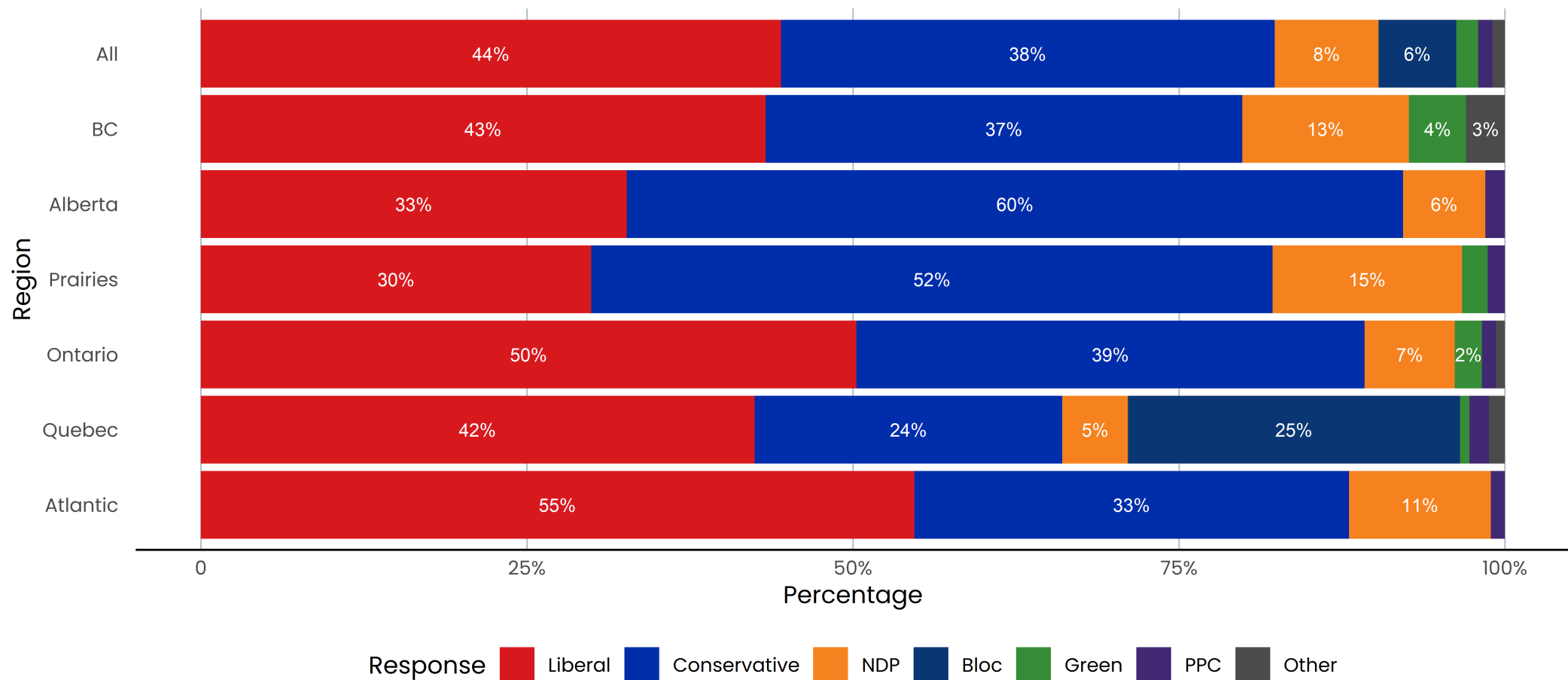

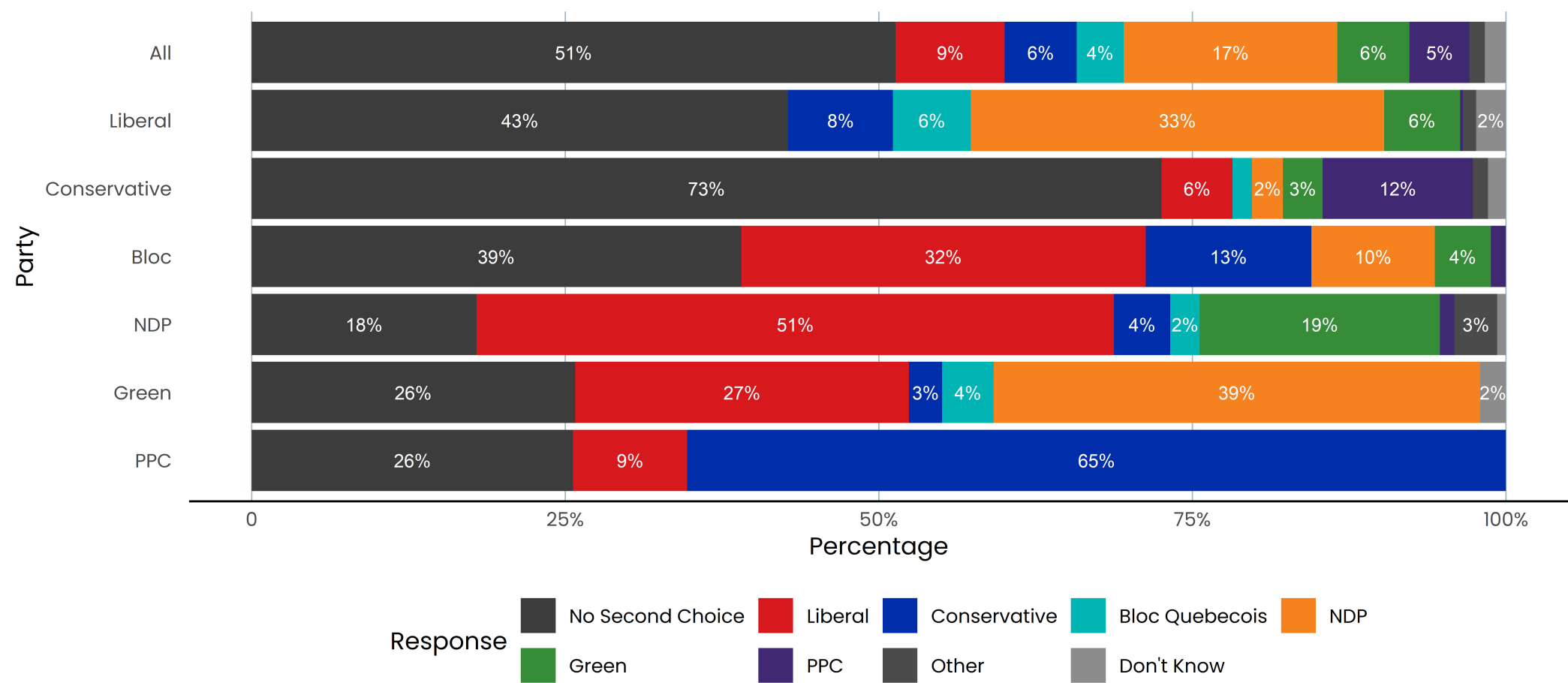

Which of the following federal political parties would be your 2nd choice?

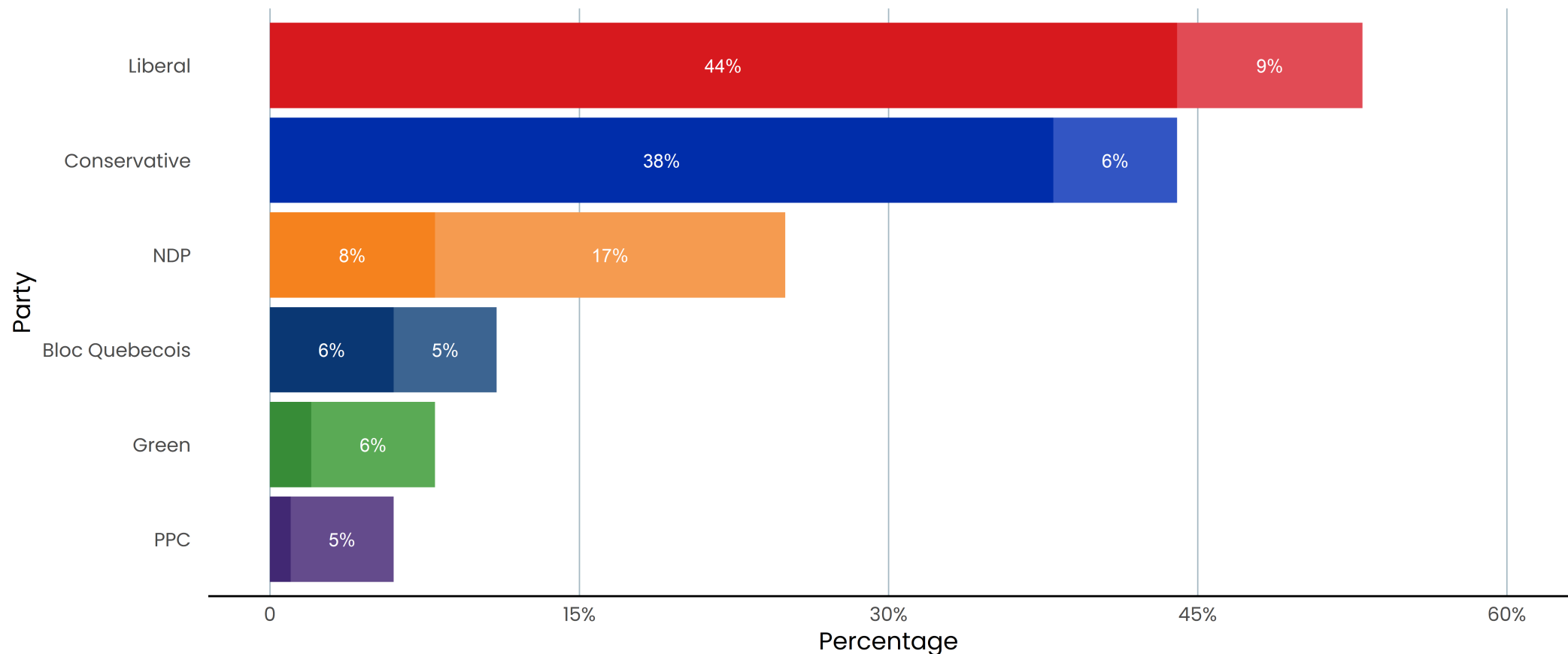

Parties sorted by combined total

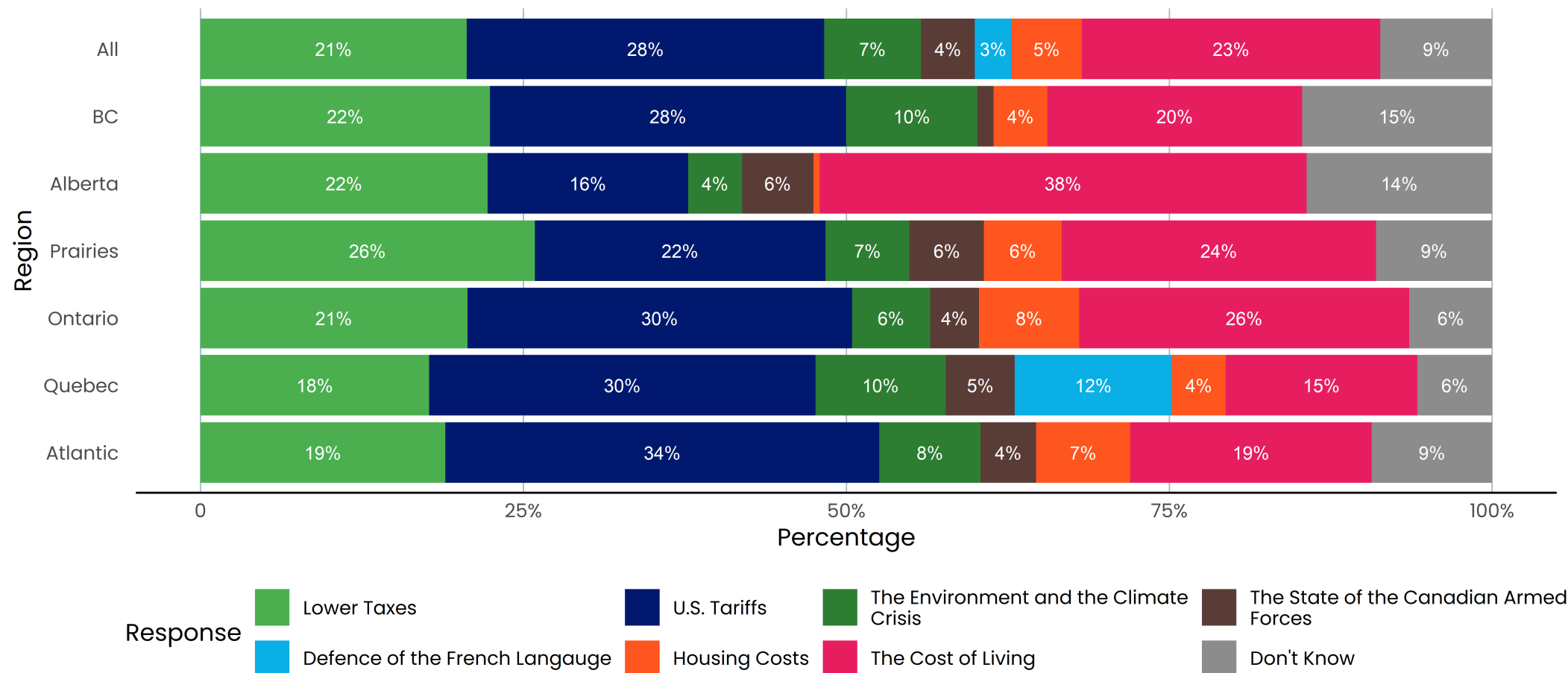


Darker colours represent first choice, lighter colours represent second choice

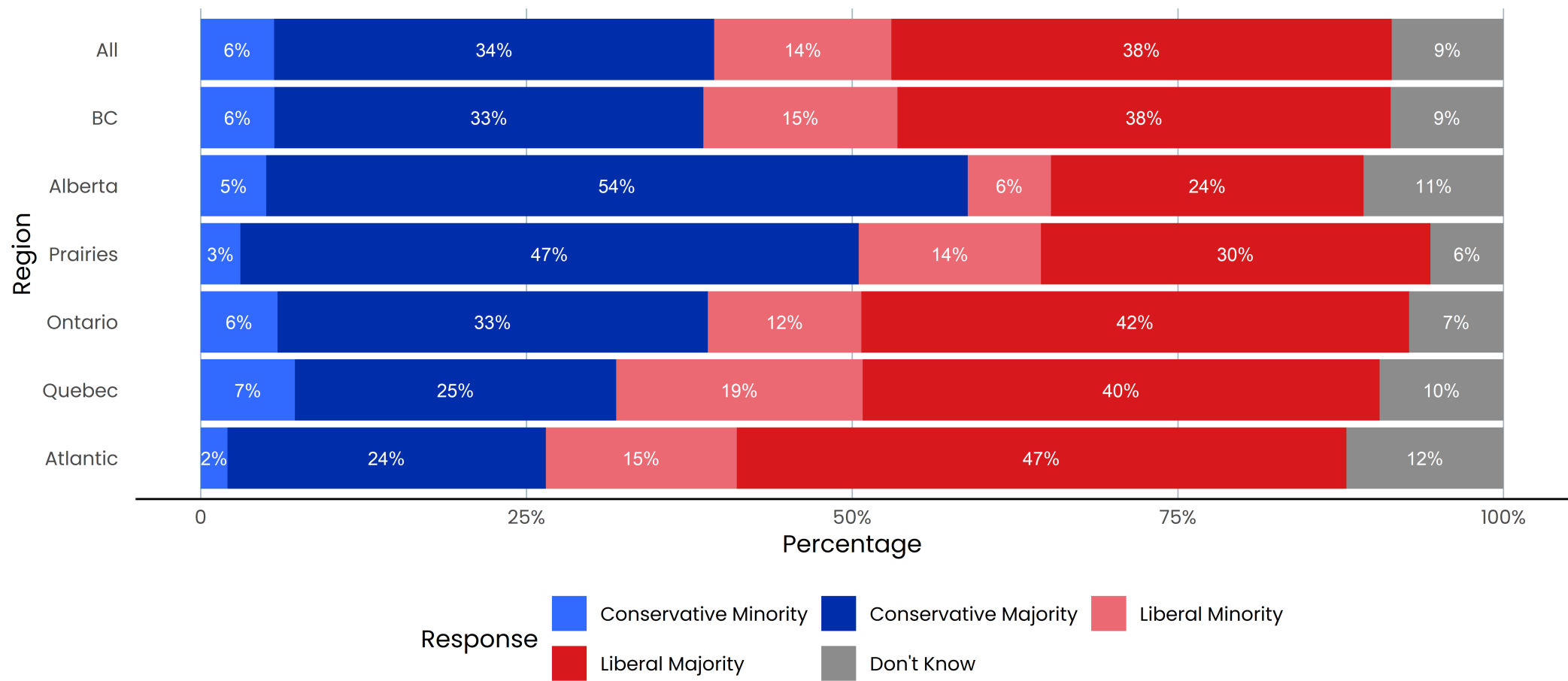

Which election result would you prefer?

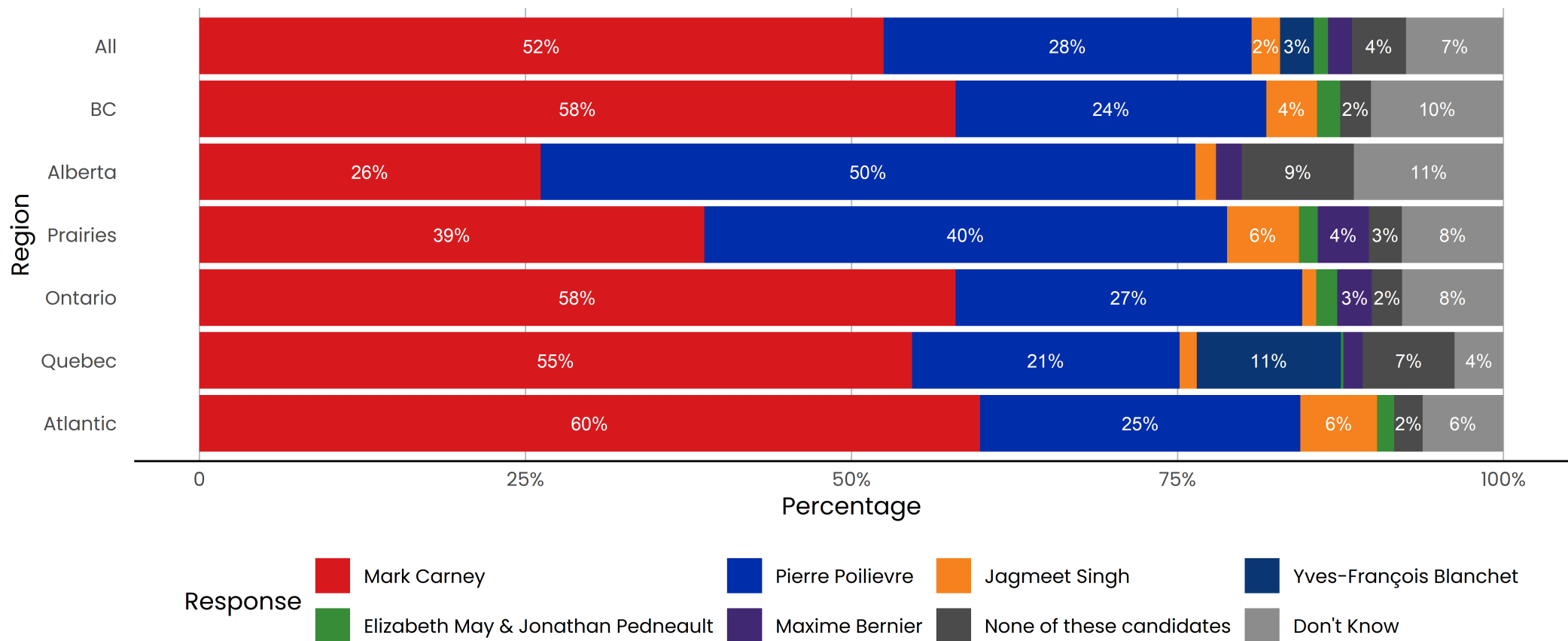

Which of the party leaders has given the best response to last Wednesday's tariff announcement from the United States?

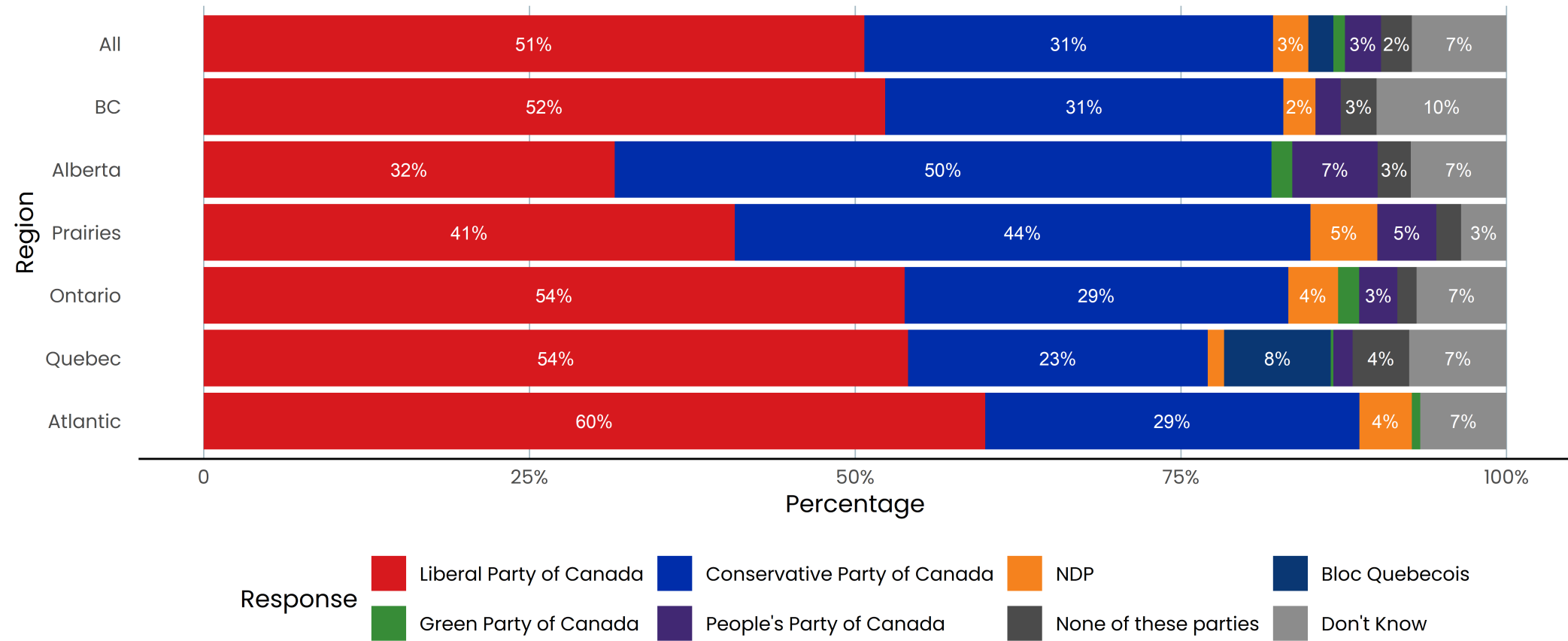

The Best Policy To Respond To Trump

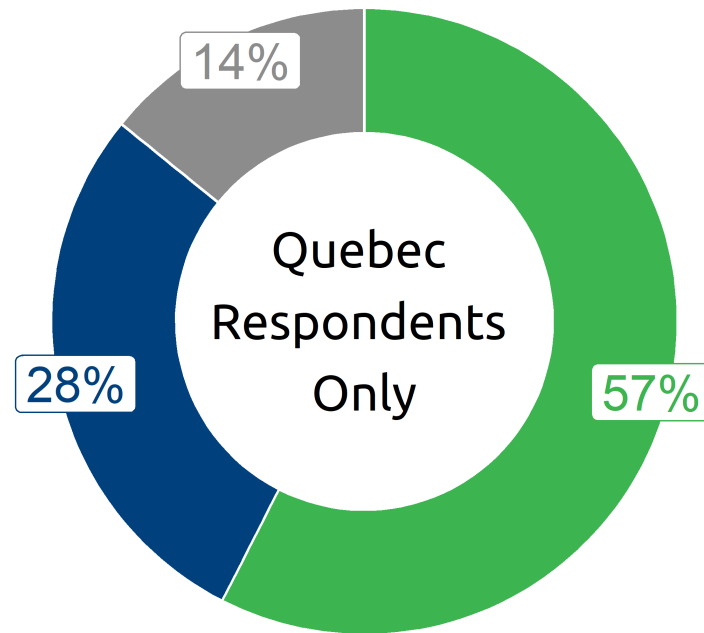
Which party do you think has the best program to address Donald Trump's policies towards Canada?
