Get **Industry** Ready!

For those who are career and college ready, the next stage is admission to South Central College (SCC)! You will start taking the college courses that serve as the foundation of your healthcare or manufacturing award or degree. And you won't be doing it alone. Your Adult Basic Education instructor will sit in on your classes to help you and provide tutoring services.

SCC **Healthcare** Foundation:

Medical Terminology and Certified Nursing Assistant courses

SCC **Manufacturing** Foundation:

Advanced Manufacturing Core (CMAE) and Certified Production Technology courses

*To register for the Bridge course *Requirements for the Bridge course, you must be at least 18 years old and legally eligible to work in the U.S., take the TABE test with results indicating further preparation is advised for college, be physically able and willing to perform healthcare or manufacturing work, be able to commit to attending class and completing homework each week. Those following the Healthcare path will also need to undergo a \$20 background study.



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
