
Hi everyone!

WDI OFFICE HIGHLIGHT: OWATONNA



We are so excited to again have an office open in Owatonna! The state approved the funding for the office at the end of June 2021 and by mid-October 2021 we secured our new location at 1850 Austin Rd. We are especially pleased to be collocated with our friends and collaborators United Way of Steele County. Open drop-in hours for the office are Tuesday and Thursdays from 9a-3pm or any day by appointment. Let's take a minute to introduce the team in Owatonna.

Carrie Johnson is the Dislocated Worker Career Planner serving adults who are on unemployment and need help figuring out their best next steps. She provides assistance with resumes, career exploration, and can even help pay for retraining for her clients who want to enter a new Career Pathway. Kim Purscell is our Outreach Specialist who spends much of her time reaching out to local business and organizations to help match career seekers with the job and training opportunities that businesses have available. Megan Horton runs the Steele Co Works program, a partnership with the United Way and Owatonna Chamber of Commerce that helps high school students explore careers and get placed in work experiences. This enables the students to be fully prepared and employed in Owatonna's local workforce when they graduate. Dawne Buttera is a Navigator for our Bridges to Healthcare program. She works with Owatonna Adult Basic Education students to help them finish the education they need to work in the healthcare field. Finally, Jawahir Mohamed is our On-Ramp Navigator and helps Adult Basic Education students get prepared for work in Manufacturing and Information Technologies sectors. The office may look small but we've got a LOT going on!

FEATURED SUCCESS STORY: BROOKE MORENO





In March 2021, Brooke Moreno had been working as a server at 1st of Thai restaurant in Faribault when she, like many other parents, was forced with a decision to make. The Covid-19 pandemic meant that Brooke's daughter would be transitioning to distance learning. As a single parent, Brooke felt that she had no option but to leave her role so that she could stay home and support her daughter.

"I found myself on Unemployment for the first time in my life at 32," Brooke told staff at Workforce Development. Brooke felt that this time of transition was an opportunity in her life to think intentionally about the next step she wanted to take in building her career. Going back to school had always been something Brooke had wanted to do, and when she connected with a Career Planner at Workforce Development through the Dislocated Worker program, Brooke knew that this was her shot.

Brooke recounted those first few conversations with her Career Planner as they discussed her skillsets and strengths. Brooke knew that she was passionate about massage therapy and that the Aveda Arts and Sciences Institute in Minneapolis had a strong reputation that would make her well-prepared to start a career in massage therapy. Through the support of two new grants awarded to Workforce Development – one aimed to help those who have lost their job because of the Covid-19 pandemic and one to help those impacted by the opioid crisis in Minnesota – Brooke's tuition to attend Aveda Arts and Sciences Institute would be paid for.

After five months of attending school full time, Brooke completed her 600-hour Massage Therapy course at the Aveda Arts and Sciences Institute in Minneapolis and received her Massage Therapist License. "Like most people," Brooke explained, "the Covid-19 pandemic has made a major impact in my life. But there was nothing better or more honoring than to be motivated by my own union and community."

Brooke now offers massage appointments at Studio 14 Salon and Spa in Faribault as well as at Humfeld Chiropractic & Nutrition Center in Faribault. She has also decided that she will be starting her own massage therapy business: M.M.M Serenity, LLC. Brooke will be joining the Converting Layoffs Into Minnesota Businesses (CLIMB) program which is designed to help Minnesota residents start their own businesses.

When asked how it felt going from unemployed to full time student to now entrepreneur in the last year, Brooke stated, "I am proud of myself for making an example for my teenage kid and I am happy our community is there to help us pick ourselves up during hardship. It was not easy but I had the ability to move forward each day with the support of the staff at the CareerForce center. I could not ask for a better support system."

After she graduates, she plans to go to college to become a diesel mechanic and wants to continue her career at Kibble Equipment.

When I started at WDI in April of 2021, I was transferred a client who had been working with the career planner before me. She had been out of work and searching for a job for right around one year at that time. When I met with her, she expressed that she was starting to lose hope and lose confidence in herself. She couldn't understand why she wasn't being offered jobs or even interviews. She had a commendable work history and an updated resume and cover letter. She was working hard each day applying at different jobs in the area. She seemed to be running out of steam.

She started to feel even more depressed because she was having trouble keeping up with her bills and other expenses. I encouraged her and lifted her up- I offered her all the possible financial and transportation supports available to us, as well as emotional support. I reminded her that the job search process can be long and tedious, and I even shared a bit of my own personal job search history; I let her know that I was starting to feel the same way before I got hired here at WDI. This seemed to help her a bit, and she kept in contact with me weekly to ask my opinion about certain applications or seek feedback on different aspects of her job search process.

What really stood out to me was her perseverance; despite countless disappointments and refusals, she continued to apply. She had her heart set on Mayo Clinic and had applied and been turned down for the same few jobs repeatedly. Even though she continued to be rejected, she continued to reapply. Finally, after a year and a half of this, she was offered not one, but two job interviews at Mayo Clinic! She went to them both and was offered both! After all the disappointment, she got to pick between two of her top job choices at Mayo! This just goes to show that with determination and a bit of support from others, success is possible. I am so proud to be part of this wonderful organization where I can really make a difference in people's lives.


