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GENERAL FAIR RULES

ENTERING AN EXHIBIT

1. The exhibit classes are listed in the 2021 Priddis & Millarville Fair Book and online in Showworks (primil.fairwire.com). Please note that some exhibit classes require a virtual entry that **MUST** be submitted via Showworks.
2. Exhibitors can register using the entry forms at the back of the Fair Book and delivering or mailing the forms to the MRAS office at any time up to the entry deadline OR register online at primil.fairwire.com commencing July 1, 2021.
3. An annual \$5.00 registration fee is charged for each exhibitor over the age of 5. Each entry is charged a fee that is listed for each department. All entry forms and payments must be received no later than August 8, 2021.
4. Entry fees can be paid online via Paypal in Showworks, by e-transfer to Fair@MillarvilleRacetrack.com or by cheque, cash, credit or debit payment through the MRAS office.
5. No entry fees can be refunded.
6. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor for at least 30 days prior to the Fair. Proof must be available if requested.
7. Age for junior exhibitors is as of January 1, 2021.
8. Junior exhibitors may enter in an age group higher but not lower than their own age.
9. Blank tags may be purchased for the Flower, Fruit & Vegetable Departments only. They can be used for any class within these Departments. The exhibitor must fill in the class number and description on the tag when dropping their exhibit off for judging.



GENERAL FAIR RULES

FAIR WEEKEND

1. Bench exhibit departments - Arts & Handicrafts (except Division 7230), Fibre Arts, Flowers, Home Cooking & Baking, Vegetables & Fruit and Woodworking - will be received, judged, displayed and picked up in the arena at the Millarville Racetrack. The exhibitor is responsible for:
 - picking up an entry tag for each exhibit that identifies the exhibitor and the exhibit
 - securely attaching the tag to the exhibit
 - delivering the exhibit to the designated department area in the arena for judging
 - picking up their entry after 3:00 p.m. on Fair Saturday.
2. Tags can be picked up and exhibits dropped off starting at 11:00 a.m. on Friday August 20, 2021. Exhibits must be in place by 5:00 p.m. for judging that evening.
3. Please note that bench exhibits in Photography and Division 7230 (Adult Arts & Handicrafts - Virtual Painting & Drawings) are virtual for 2021 and must be uploaded in Showworks by Friday August 8, 2021. Maximum photo size is 8 MB. Instructions on how to upload entries can be found on the MRAS website.
4. Equestrian exhibitors will be supplied with an identification number to be worn on their backs on the day of the show.
5. Beef cattle exhibitors will be given identification numbers at ringside on the day of the show.
6. For 2021, Sheep and Dairy Goat entries are limited to virtual showmanship classes. Please review the information in the relevant department section for specific instructions on what to include in your submission. Instructions on how to upload entries can be found on the MRAS website. Maximum video size is 120 MB.
7. No animal suffering from a contagious or infectious disease will be allowed on the MRAS grounds.
8. Fair volunteers are not responsible for damage to or theft of the exhibits.
9. Exhibits are to be picked up from the arena between 3:00 pm. and 5:00 pm on Fair Saturday. No exhibits are to be removed from display before 3:00 p.m. The Fair Department Managers are not responsible for any articles left on the grounds or in facilities after 6:00 p.m. on Fair Saturday.
10. The sale of exhibits is not allowed on the Fair grounds.



JUDGING

1. The Judges shall act with impartiality and in compliance with judging standards set by Department Managers or standards set out for sanctioned shows as detailed in each relevant department.
2. Further information on judging methodology can be found on the MRAS website at www.MillarvilleRacetrack.com/fair.
3. Judging for all virtual classes will take place between the entry deadline of Friday August 8 and Friday August 20, 2021. Results will be emailed to exhibitors on Saturday August 21, 2021. The entries and results will be displayed in photo galleries on the MRAS website.
4. The Fair Committee and Judges are bound by the rules of the Fair.
5. The Judge has the authority to move an exhibit between classes if the judge deems it to be in the incorrect class.
6. Any award granted will be at the discretion of the Judge.

PRIZES

1. Each class, unless otherwise noted in the rules for each department, has a cash prize payout for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place. The amount paid is noted with each department.
2. An Award of Excellence rosette will be given for each bench department, selected by the Judge(s) for the best exhibit in that department.
3. Prize money will be paid in early September via e-transfer or cheque. The Fair will gratefully accept any winnings as a donation to the Fair.

1. Only one rider per horse.
2. Appropriate English equipment, tack and attire shall be used in all events. All competitors must wear a properly fitted, approved helmet with safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet, and boots with heels.
3. Riders may ride in a higher age group but not lower and must be consistent throughout the day.
4. Competitors may enter in a maximum of three consecutive height divisions for over fence classes.
5. Classes with less than four entries may be cancelled.
6. Jumper classes will be one round. Clear rounds will come back for a timed jump-off where fences may be raised by up to three inches, unless indicated otherwise.
7. No Stallions allowed.
8. Riders not at ringside when called for their class will forfeit that ride.

NOTES:

- Equitation over fences: Judged on how riders are positioned and how effective they are in using their aids when completing a course over fences.
- Match the clock (optimum time): Competitors with equal jumping faults will be placed according to how close their time is to the optimum time, based on the course being ridden at the posted speed.
- Gamblers Choice: Obstacles on the course have different point values. Time is fixed. Competitors can jump any obstacle in any order / direction. After the time is elapsed competitors can "gamble" and attempt the "joker" +200 if clear, -200 if refused or knocked down. High score wins.

GUIDELINES & TIPS

1. A bouquet is not an arrangement. You collect flowers in the hand and drop into a vase - do not arrange them in a vase.
2. Gladioli & Dahlias are summer-blooming bulbs unless otherwise noted.
3. Submit the exact number of blooms where specified.
4. Please name varieties if possible.
5. Condition of flowers is very important - they should be very fresh.
6. Six stems means stems are shown, not just the blossom, so that stems set off the blossoms.
7. When entering annual and perennial classes, choose uniform blooms.
8. Containers are judged in display classes only.

GUIDELINES & TIPS

1. A bouquet is not an arrangement. You collect flowers in the hand and drop into a vase - do not arrange them in a vase.
2. Have the exact number of blooms when it is specified in the class to avoid disqualification.
3. Please name varieties, if possible.
4. Condition of flowers is very important - they should be very fresh.
5. Choose uniform blooms when entering any 'annual' classes.
6. Containers are judged only in the 'Unusual Containers' and 'Arrangement' classes.

Note to Parents: Please accept that your child's ideas might be better than yours!

The Judges will expect the exhibitor to do 95% of the work on their entries.

6. Judges appreciate any pertinent information to describe your entry on the entry tag. e.g. type of fruit in fruit pie class, variety of cookie in cookie classes.
7. Display effectively: we encourage the use of props such as doilies, baskets, or colourful napkins to give the exhibit additional eye appeal.
