Lincoln High School initially opened in the fall of 1907 with 900 students. Over time, Lincoln grew, with multiple additions, before finally becoming a 4-year high school in 1971. In 1981, Lincoln was closed and since then the building was used for a variety of purposes including as an interim location for different Seattle schools during their renovations.

In February, 2013 Seattle voters approved a Building Excellence initiative which set in motion the modernization of the existing brick building allowing Lincoln High School to reopen in 2019! This fall Lincoln will expand to all grades, 9-12 with a supportive and involved staff, PTSA, community and an active alumni group who are all excited to continue the Lincoln Lynx traditions as well as begin new ones.

Student Assignment Fall 2021

Open Enrollment for School Choice for the 2021-22 school year is February 1 - 19, 2020 for students currently enrolled in Seattle Public Schools. School Choice forms are available on the SPS website www.seattleschools.org/admissions/registration Open Enrollment is the annual period where students may first apply to attend a different school or program next year. The school choice period continues until May 31, but on-time applications are those received during Open Enrollment (Feb. 1-19) and will be processed with applicable tiebreakers. Choice applications are accepted through May 31 but are not eligible for priority tiebreakers. Open Enrollment results are typically available online in April.

Choice forms received after February 19, 2021 will not be eligible for tiebreaker consideration but will be placed in the order received and by lottery number.

Key Enrollment Dates:

- Online Enrollment for new students for 2021-22 school year begins: January 4, 2021
- Open Enrollment for School Choice: February 1 19, 2021
- Open Enrollment results available online in April
- School Choice Window Closes: May 31, 2021

Who needs to complete a School Choice form during Open Enrollment?:

- All current SPS students residing in the Lincoln attendance area will automatically be assigned to Lincoln. You DO NOT need to complete a choice form UNLESS you are hoping to attend another area high school other than Lincoln.
- Current HC eligible 8th grade students who live in the Ballard, Ingraham, Lincoln, Nathan Hale, and Roosevelt attendance areas will automatically be assigned to Lincoln for HC. You DO NOT need to complete a choice form UNLESS you would like to attend your attendance area school.
- Dual Language Immersion students living outside the Lincoln attendance area boundary desiring to continue to Lincoln, MUST FILE A CHOICE FORM during Open Enrollment. Mark the application "Dual Language Immersion".
- Current HC eligible or Dual-Language Immersion 9-11 grade students will have to actively choose to move to Lincoln during Open Enrollment by completing a choice form.

Lincoln House System

At Lincoln the social/emotional welfare of our students is important to us as part , of the learning environment. Students at Lincoln HS are placed into individual mentorship (advisory) classes when they cognitio arrive as new students. Each

mentorship is assigned to one of four different houses, which will ensure that

incoming freshmen and new transfer students have a group they can

Triangulum be immediately connected with. This will also create a system wherein older students will feel connected to and responsible for younger students, as spirit competitions and assemblies are structured

around house vs house competition rather than class vs class. Students will stay with their house for all four years of high school.

Mentorship classes occur twice per week where students build community, receive lessons on social-emotional learning, get support with college/career planning, and receive academic supports.



Lynx Crew is a high school transition program built on the belief that students can help students succeed in high school by training upper classman to be Lynx Leaders. Lynx Crew is our peer orientation program for 9th graders.

We know that transitioning to high school life is exciting. stressful, and maybe even scary--all at the same time! Our Lynx Crew is here to support you on your way starting with Orientation at the start of school and providing teambuilding, information, support and guidance throughout the school year.

Core Academic Building Blocks

How DO we "learn with passion, act with courage and improve the world"? At Lincoln we prioritize student voice and choice and deeper, applied learning. As a result, all students are involved in:

PBL

(Project Based Learning) - A method to gain knowledge by authentically engaging in complex real world questions, challenges and problems.

SLC

(Student Led Conferences) - An annual, student facilitated opportunity to bring together home life and school life, share portfolios of work and reflections on learning.

Student Exhibitions

Twice yearly presentations of learning where students share the process and product of their learning to an audience beyond the classroom.

Laptops @ Lincoln

Seattle Public School offers all Lincoln students the option of checking out a district-issued laptop during the school year. The laptop can be used at school and home. District-issued laptops include free repairs, tech support from district staff, and the guarantee of compatibility with all school-required software and tools. Students are encouraged to borrow a district-issued laptop for ease of connecting with school resources and networks, even if they have access to a personal computer*. Checking out a district-issued laptop does not mean that a student cannot bring their own device if they choose; it can be a useful backup in case of technology incompatibility, breakage of the student's personal device, and other challenges. District tech support staff are not allowed to assist with students' personal devices for liability reasons.

If a student chooses to use their personal device at school, the current minimum computer specifications to ensure the ability to run the basic software most end users operate is:

- Processor dual core @ 2.4 GHz (i5 or i7 Intel processor or equivalent AMD)
- RAM 8 GB
- Hard Drive 320 GB 5400 RPM hard drive
- Camera (built-in or attached).

 Windows (familiarity 2004).

Wireless (for laptops) - 802.11g/n (WPA2 support required) Low-income families may qualify for \$10/month home internet, and discounted smartphone packages. Find out more at http://www.seattle.gov/tech/services or ask your child's counselor or the school librarian for details.

Academic & Social Emotional Support

Academic Support Center & BASH (Before & After School Help) Lincoln offers academic support to students in a variety of ways from the Academic Support Center open during school hours to BASH. During BASH students can drop-in to complete homework, join study groups, collaborate with classmates, get help from tutors and staff, or meet with Lincoln's Academic Dean, Ms. Pentecost.

Teen Health Center The Teen Health Center is located at Lincoln High School and is operated by Neighborcare Health, a community health center



with funding support from the City of Seattle's Families and Education Levy.

The Teen Health Center is staffed full time by a Physician Assistant, Mental Health Therapists, and a Health Educator, providing all the services (and more) that your family doctor provides in a teen-friendly setting.

^{*}Chromebooks are not compatible with some software required for art and technology programs. Mac/Apple devices may have difficulty connecting to the school wireless network.

^{*}There are many computers at retailers like Costco and Best Buy in the \$500 range that will suffice.

Course Registration

We will send course registration information to our newly assigned Lynx student's over spring break via email and US mail. * Personalized Pathway Requirements (PPR) are electives in any subject that align with the student's interests and their High School and Beyond Plan. The arts and world language credits can be replaced with other electives, based on the student's plan
