All completed online orders will be delivered to Salmon Bay School. Distribution of completed orders will be organized by Salmon Bay school staff and communicated to families.
(orders will likely be available at a designated table during pick-up and/or drop-off at the school)

Once an order is placed online, its status will be updated on a regular basis. Customers will be notified when books are scheduled to be delivered to Salmon Bay.

Online shoppers should choose the pick-up in-store option UNLESS they prefer orders shipped directly to their house (shipping charges will apply). ALL orders that choose pick-up in-store will be available for pick-up at Salmon Bay School at the conclusion of the book fair.

Books not in stock in the store will be ordered at the close of the book fair (11/23) with the goal of having all or the majority of orders completed and distributed by 12/10. These books will be available for pick-up at the Secret Garden store when they arrive.

Please remember that there are currently world-wide supply chain and shipping issues. Secret Garden will make every effort to have books arrive in a timely manner. Customers will be notified directly of any issues with their orders.
