Give loons space

- Please stay at least 150 feet away from loons (no wake distance)
- Give a loon more space if it calls or shows other signs of distress
- A good pair of binoculars is the best way to “get close” to loons!


Fish Lead Free

- It's the law! Loons can ingest lead fishing tackle from a line or attached to a fish. Use only non-lead, fishing tackle to protect loons and other wildlife
- Dispose of fishing line properly

DID YOU KNOW?

- Ingested lead fishing tackle is by far the leading known cause of adult loon mortality in New Hampshire
- Loons can abandon their nest if approached too closely by people
- It's a lot of work to raise 1 or 2 loon chicks – please give the loon parents space so they can take care of their chicks
