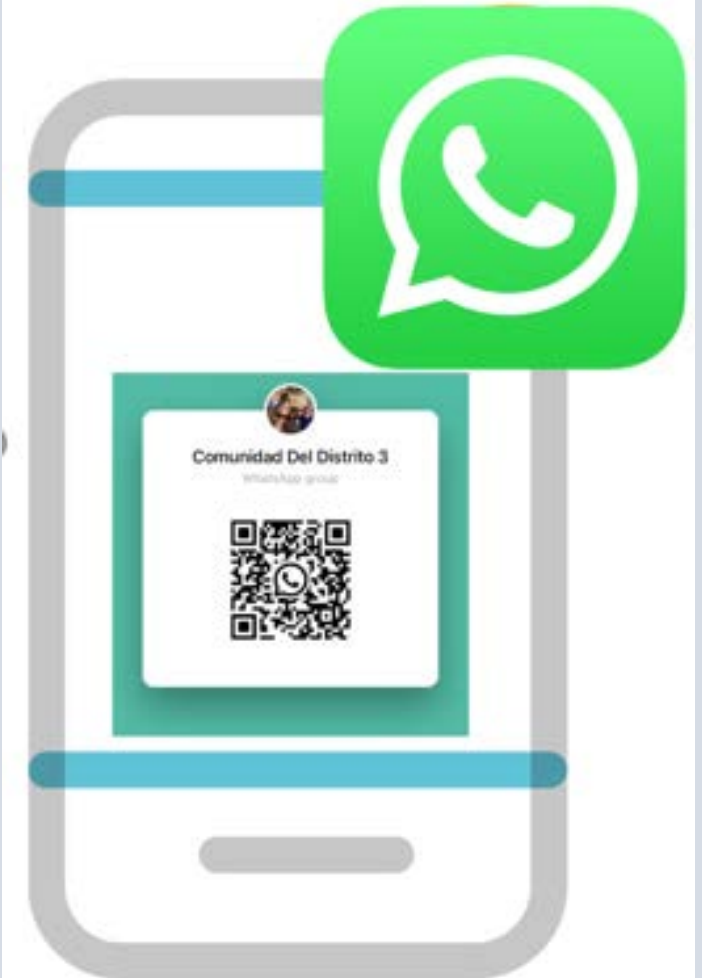

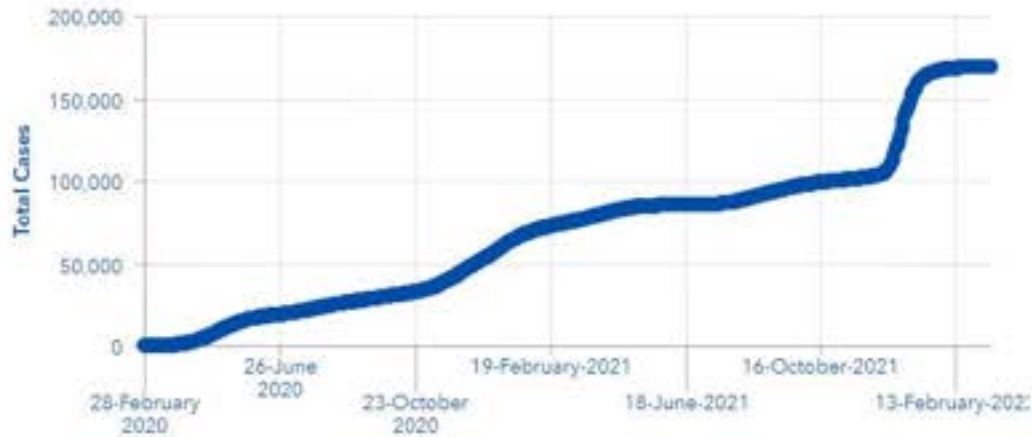

Total Cases by Day

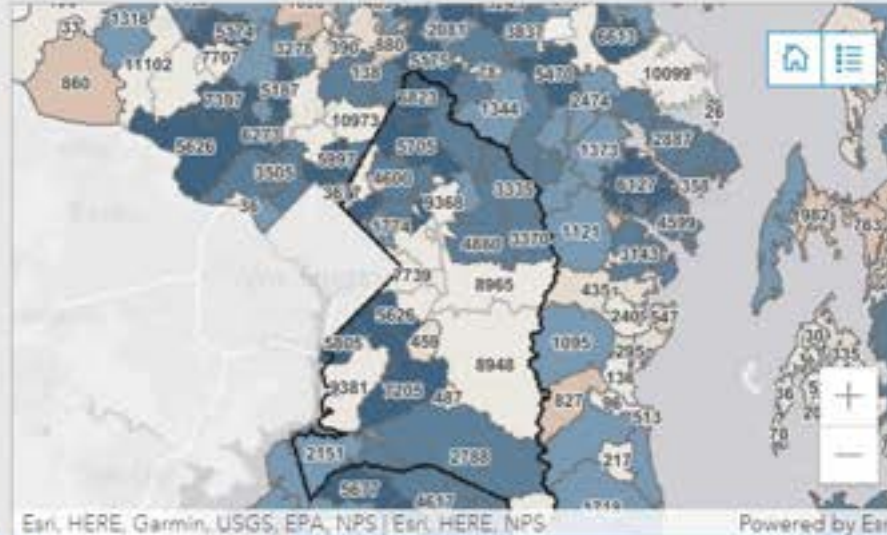

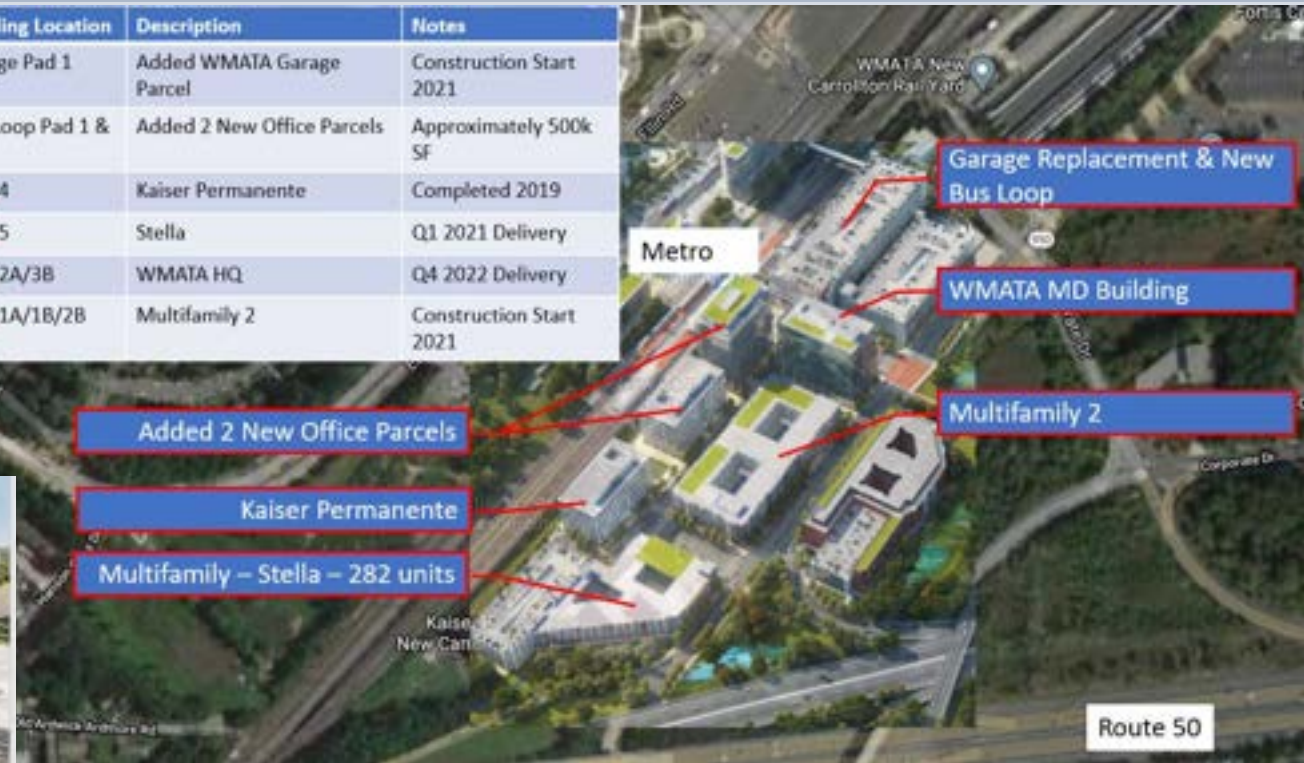

Strengthening Our Communities: School Construction Next Phase



* Prince George's County Public Schools will utilize a design, build, finance and maintenance (DBFM) alternative financing model to deliver six (6) new public schools by 2023

* First jurisdiction in the nation to utilize the private sector to bundle a multi-school construction program. This unique partnership, called Alternative Construction Financing (ACF)

* Five (5) new middle schools and one (1) K-8 school, in just three (3) years totaling more than 8,000 seats.

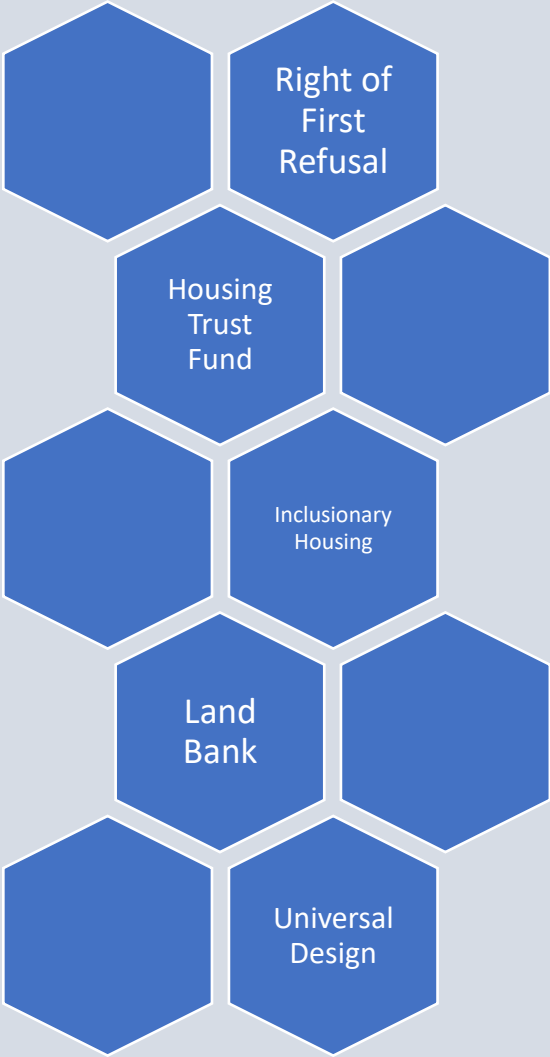

3 For the purpose of establishing a sustainable source of funding for the Housing Investment Trust
4 Fund by reallocating a certain percentage of the County's recordation taxes to provide support
5 for the fund; requiring certain financing for the fund; permitting the County Council to reduce
6 the percentage dedicated to the Housing Investment Trust Fund when there is a declared national
7 recession; requiring an annual report; and generally relating to the Housing Investment Trust
8 Fund.

Strengthening Our Communities: 1,000 new affordable housing units coming to D3 along the Purple Line

Metro announces first affordable housing developments supported by the Amazon Housing Equity Fund coming to New Carrollton and College Park

Projects will bring 748 new homes to Prince George's County



In partnership with the Redevelopment Authority, I worked to ensure the County-owned park police building across from the Beacon Heights-East Pines Purple Line station will be redeveloped into multi-family housing and retail, including 250 units of affordable housing. The Special Operations Division will be vacating the space in fall 2023 before construction begins.

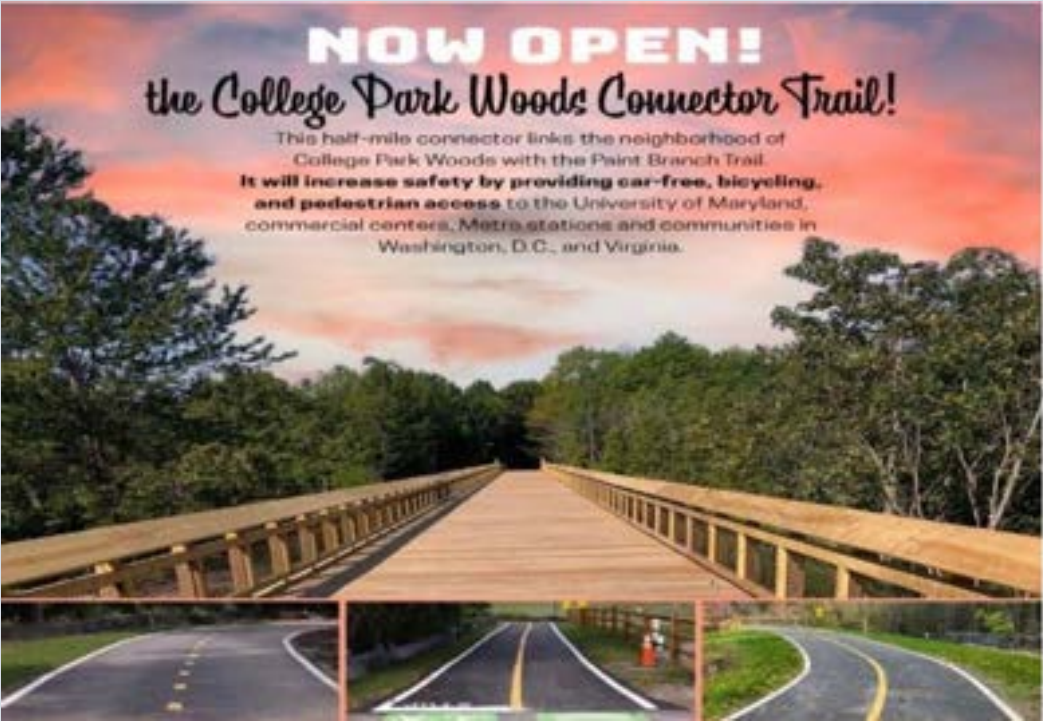

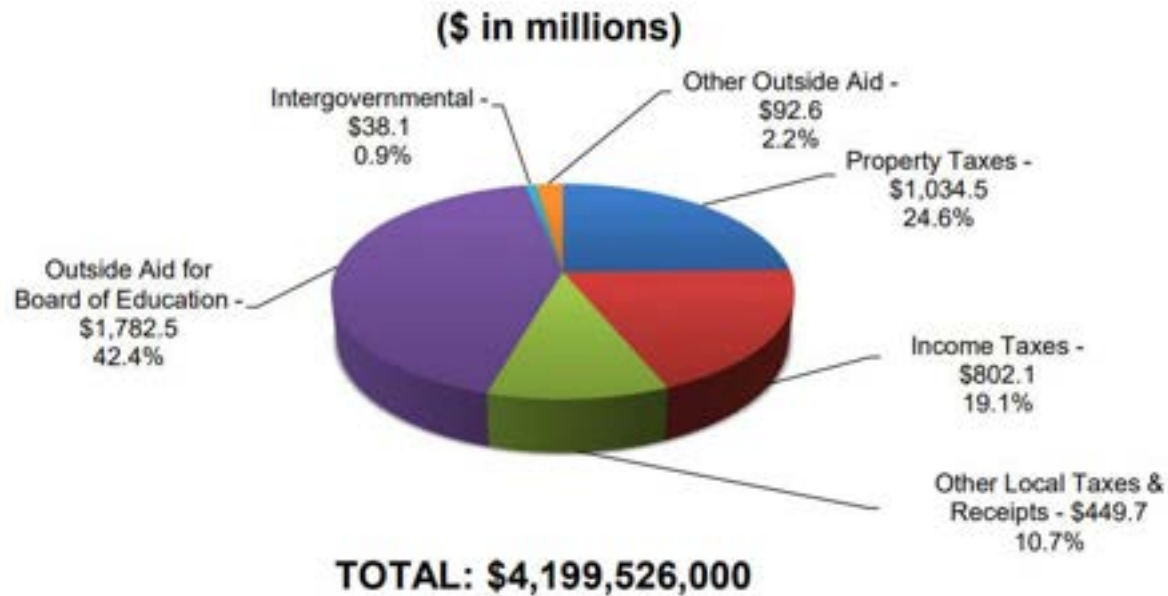

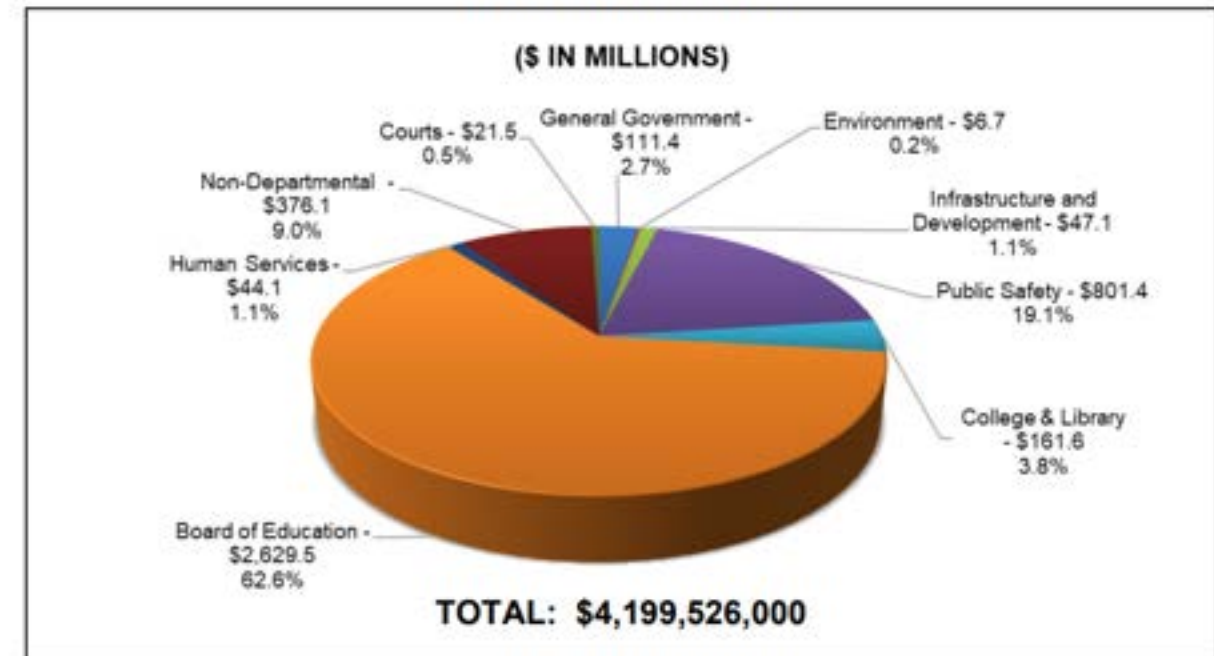

Principles

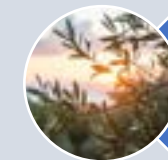
