






Current Village of Key Biscayne COVID-19 Status

Cases on the Key

As of today, the FDOH report indicates **65 positive** COVID-19 cases on the Key. We do not receive personal information about infected residents from FDOH. The data found in the Florida Department of Health (FDOH) daily report may differ from data available on Florida's COVID-19 Data and Surveillance Dashboard. Data in these reports are provisional and subject to change.

The Drive-Thru Testing Site has tested 837 residents, 8 of whom tested positive. The Mobile Testing Unit has tested 89 residents, 4 of whom tested positive.

What is the Village doing with the results from testing?

The data collected from the mobile testing unit and the drive-thru testing site will allow us to track whether there is an increase in active infections as we gradually return to a new normal. We will use this data to inform policy decisions and steer response efforts.

COVID-19 Testing

There is a global demand for COVID-19 testing, as a result testing is contingent on availability of testing resources. At this time, testing for COVID-19 is available to **Key Biscayne residents**: aged 65 and older with COVID-19 symptoms; of any age with symptoms and serious underlying medical conditions (immunocompromised, have diabetes, heart or pulmonary conditions); that are frontline or essential workers;

who are homebound; or who have had contact with someone that has tested positive. Appointments are made through the Village of Key Biscayne **COVID-19 Response Call Center (305-365-8910)**, which operates Monday through Friday 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

If a Key Biscayne resident does not meet the eligibility criteria for COVID-19 testing, the Key Biscayne Community Foundation allows residents to purchase a test.

Drive-Thru Testing Site

The Village of Key Biscayne and Key Biscayne Community Foundation continue to work collaboratively to serve Key Biscayne residents through the drive-thru testing site.

When: Mondays and Thursdays

Where: St. Agnes Catholic Church

Hours: 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

How: To make an appointment, residents can call the COVID-19 Response Call Center or go to KBCovidTesting.org. Please expect either an email confirmation that your application has been received and is being processed or a phone call within 24-48 hours. If you haven't received either, please call the COVID-19 Response Call Center.

Mobile Testing Unit (MTU)

The Village of Key Biscayne Fire Rescue operates the mobile testing unit based on demand.

When: As Needed

Where: Your Residence

How: The mobile testing unit is geared toward homebound residents who meet the eligibility criteria. Appointments are made through the COVID-19 Response Call Center.

Contact Tracing

Contact tracing is an important step to stop COVID-19 transmission, and to protect friends, family, and community members from COVID-19. If you have tested positive, you should alert those you may have had close contact with during the past 4 weeks. Anyone you have had contact with should self-isolate for 14 days, monitor their health for signs of COVID-19, and are encouraged to get tested for COVID-19.
