- The summer of 2022 marked the 5th year of the Primary Care Exploration Program that sends rising M2's into rural communities for 6 weeks in the summer to work with rural preceptors. In 2022, 22 students were placed. Of the 22, 11 were MRPSP scholars. The program is funded by the hospitals and clinics around the state who pay for \$1500 stipends for the students. This year we also received some funding from the IMPACT the Race grant that provided some stipends as well as some housing stipends for student participants.
- In May of 2021, the MRPSP graduated 21 medical students into residency training.
- The 64 undergraduates currently in the MRPSP represent 11 different four year institutions in the state (and 2 out-of-state institutions) and 8 different community colleges. 47% of our undergraduates are from underrepresented populations.
