## Junior Warden's Report — Submitted by David Allen

• Building and Grounds: The Committee has not met yet in May, but was involved with the Church clean-up.

The spring clean up for the Church went rather well. Lots of old stuff was removed from the storage areas of the Church and access to the things we currently use has been improved. Thank you to all who helped with this project.

The Safety and Security review for the Church is in process. David Allen and Jerry Kirkwood met with Sue and Marc Deras with Deras Door and Lock Company to discuss installing two doors in the lower level of Saint Michaels — one at the foot of the stairs by our parking lot entrance and one close to the boiler room area. These doors are designed as security doors to allow the day school to isolate the area that they use on a daily basis. This will make access to the day school much safer and will allow the day school to monitor who comes in, and what time they enter. This will also help them in the event of a storm. Additional doors will be added by the Carpenter Ants to allow access in between the south class rooms in the day school. As it stands now, some of the class rooms only have one entrance and exit point which could potentially be an issue if a fire were to occur. The day school has pledged the funds to pay for the improvements with the doors and I have also had a parishioner pledge funds so there should be no impact on the B&G budget.

#### **Financial Review and Commentary**

- Pledge revenue remains strong and ahead of year to date budget. It is believed to be primarily timing and not new membership.
- Operating expenses in total were slightly favorable to budget for the month. Year to date operating
  expenses were \$32K favorable to budget, however, rector search and capital spending projects have
  not occurred yet so the favorable budget is partly timing.
- The operating fund remains at a satisfactory level at \$254K.
- Cash in all funds is \$242K at month end.
