What is Advent?

Though Advent appears at the end of our calendar year, it is the beginning of the Christian year. The deep darkness of the natural world around us is an echo of the nurturing darkness of the dawning of Creation. It is in this holy space we begin re-telling our Sacred Stories. The word “Advent” comes from the Latin *adventus*, which means “coming” or “arrival.” During Advent we prepare and wait for the coming of Christ at Christmas and for Jesus to return and make all things new!
