


The Messenger was able to sit down with parishioner Marty Pyle, and ask him: “What are you working on these days with your art work?”

“My current studio work has centered on a painting series honoring the small businesses that help give Overland Park its character. These locally owned shops strengthen our community in countless ways—shaping our identity, enriching our culture, and reminding us what it means to support one another.

“Pictured here are three of those businesses: Overland Park Shoe Repair, Grant Mong Design and Landscaping, and Elite Comics. In each painting, I’ve focused on the people behind the counter or out in the field—the owners and employees whose daily work keeps these places thriving. Their dedication is what makes our city feel like home, and it’s been a joy to celebrate their stories through art.”

FR. DAVID'S ADULT EDUCATION CLASSES

This December the parish was able to complete a walk through *Light of the World: A Beginner's Guide to Advent* by Amy-Jill Levine. Fr. David lead us each Sunday morning as we looked at what was most important to keep in mind during this holiday season, and talking over what the true purpose of Advent should be.

Levine's book examines the birth narratives from the Gospels of Matthew and Luke, offering fresh perspectives on familiar Christmas stories. It explores the Nativity stories looking at the historical contexts and literary connections in each story.

Our conversations took a look at trends of Christendom in society today, including how the holiday season has been affected or maybe even attacked by modernity.

Starting on January 11th, Fr. David will a discussion of *How the Bible Actually Works: In Which I Explain How An Ancient, Ambiguous, and Diverse Book Leads Us to Wisdom Rather Than Answers—and Why That's Great News* by Peter Enns. MIQRA TAKING PLACE THIS MONTH IN TOPEKA

MIQRA (meek-rah): a weekend retreat for youth that focuses on the Bible and allows teens to discover what's in it, why they should care, and how to read it.

Saturday, January 17, 1 pm – Monday, January 19, 11 am, 2026

The youth will read the entire Bible from Genesis to Revelation in 72 hours! The reading is voluntary and participants take turns reading in shifts around the clock. So many fun things happen at MIQRA! They play wacky games like Church Commandos and Nave Olympics. There is a movie night. They worship with the Mustard Seeds, our diocesan youth band. Participants attend engaging workshops on various biblical topics and hear clergy speak about the Bible. Those who attend also meet with a small group several times to make friends and talk about what they're discovering about the Bible through the event.

Participants sleep on the floor of the Sunday School rooms. Sleeping rooms are divided by gender and age, as well as a non-binary sleeping room option. Attendees bring sleeping bags and pillows, although some also bring camping mats or air mattresses.
