## OUR PARISH INVOLVEMENT IN AN INTERFAITH JUSTICE NETWORK

Since its inception in 2020, St. Michael's has been involved in the development of the interfaith justice network now named the Good Faith Network (GFN). GFN is a direct action and research-based network that works to attain justice in Johnson County. Twenty congregations (Christian, Jewish, and Muslim) comprise GFN. Like many congregations,

St. Michael's excels at acts of mercy, including St. Paul's Breakfast, UpLift, and

Backsnacks. We also offer many opportunities to walk with God in the form of worship, Bible studies, and retreats. But Micah 6:8 calls us to do more: we are required to do justice. We are called to move beyond acts of mercy to address the root cause of the problem that creates the need for acts of mercy.

#### How GFN Works



We have three teams—a total of 33 parishioners. Team members commit to attend just four meetings a year: a community problems assembly (at which the network decides what issue/s to tackle); a solutions briefing (where solutions developed by the research teams are presented); the Nehemiah Assembly (where the network presents the problems and solutions to governmental authorities); and a celebration (to celebrate accomplishments and begin the process anew). Some team members serve on the research teams. Others focus on raising awareness of what GFN hopes to accomplish. All team members invite others to attend the Nehemiah Assembly as evidence to the authorities that our community needs to make changes in the name of justice.

GFN's next step is the call for action. On May 3<sup>rd</sup>, we will join nearly 500 network team members and their guests to present our findings and urge our elected officials to enact our solutions. This gathering called the Nehemiah Assembly and is based on [Nehemiah 5](#), which provides the model for our call for justice and action.

#### What You Can Do

Do you feel strongly about the need for better services in our county to address homelessness and mental health issues? When a GFN team member from St. Michael's invites you, commit to attending the Nehemiah Assembly on May 3<sup>rd</sup>.

There are similar justice networks in Lawrence ([Justice Matters](#)) and Topeka ([Topeka JUMP](#)), as well as across the country. All are taking action for change using the mandate of Micah 6:8 and the model of Nehemiah 5.

# The Shared Ministry of Children, Youth, and Families

I am thrilled to announce that Sunday School for all ages will resume Sunday, April 24, 2022, between the 8:30 and 10:45am services. We have all been waiting for this moment, and I most of all. One reason for my excitement is the opportunity this provides us to rebuild this ministry and learn together across generations.

The beginning of all discipleship, formation, and learning commences with us being together. Relationships are the foundation of all that we seek to accomplish through youth and children's programming, Sunday School classes, and parish-wide events. We all continue to learn how to be faithful Christians, and we do that by learning from each other. Children teach us how to imagine and wonder about the vast nature of God. Youth teach us to ask fearless questions about our faith and why it matters. We are all simultaneously learning from and teaching one another.

Several years ago, the kids in the preschool class I taught loved one song more than the others. "The more we get together" was our circle time song. It is how we began and ended our group time. As is true of most children's songs, the lyrics are simple: "The more we get together, together, together; the more we get together, the happier we'll be. Because your friends are my friends, and my friends are your friends. The more we get together, the happier we'll be."

This song's theme is the reality of the basic human need for connection, care, and love. It is a reminder that we are all responsible for each other throughout the entirety of our shared life together. Rebuilding, restructuring, and enriching the

programs we now have is a significant undertaking. It requires a lot of people donating their time and gifts to support our children, teens, and the ministry of this entire parish.

If we change the lyrics of that simple song from my preschool classroom, I think we might find it applies more than we could ever imagine. "The more we learn together, together, together. The more we learn together, better Christians we'll be. Because your friends are my friends, and your kids are our kids. The more we learn together, better Christians we'll be."

## Outreach



### SEEKING WAYS TO HELP UKRAINE?

There are many organizations providing a variety of aid to those in Ukraine and those who are now refugees from the war. Here are some suggested options. Charity Navigator is a good website to be aware because it rates charities on their financial health, accountability, and transparency.

**CARE** This international humanitarian organization, set up an emergency Ukrainian Crisis Fund to provide immediate support for 4 million people. Donations will go toward providing Ukrainians with water, food, supplies, hygiene kits, immediate support and aid, and cash.

**Charity Navigator** A large list of highly-rated nonprofits engaged in relief and recovery efforts in Ukraine and the surrounding region. Nonprofits addressing peace-building efforts to encourage diplomacy and prevent further military action are included. These organizations are categorized by specific efforts.

**EPISCOPAL RELIEF & DEVELOPMENT-- UKRAINE CRISIS RESPONSE FUND** ER&D is working closely with Anglican agencies and ecumenical partners to meet the urgent needs of Ukrainian refugees in Europe. Those refugees need both basic supplies and long-term support.

**Heart to Heart International** Heart to Heart International seeks to improve healthcare access in the U.S. and around the world by ensuring quality care is provided equitably in medically under-resourced communities and in disaster situations. HHI is distributing medicines, medical supplies, and hygiene items to partners in Ukraine and the surrounding countries to support refugees and restock hospitals and pharmacies.

**Razom for Ukraine** A Ukrainian-American nonprofit working to not only support emergency response to the war, but also to provide a whole host of resources for allies looking to help, including a round-up of rallies and events for people interested in showing their support for the #StandWithUkraine movement.

**The Ukrainian Congress Committee of America** This organization has launched a nationwide fundraising campaign to provide vital humanitarian aid to this population, as well as to the front-line defenders. Together with partners, they have secured warehouses in several regions where humanitarian aid supplies can be securely stored.

**World Central Kitchen** An organization on the frontlines feeding and assisting displaced Ukrainian people. Led by Chef José Andrés, World Central Kitchen is at 8 different border crossings outside of Ukraine to feed those fleeing from war. Additionally, WCK is supporting local restaurants in Odessa and Lviv working to feed Ukrainians still in the country. Their efforts are expanding into Moldova, Slovakia, and Hungary to support incoming refugees.



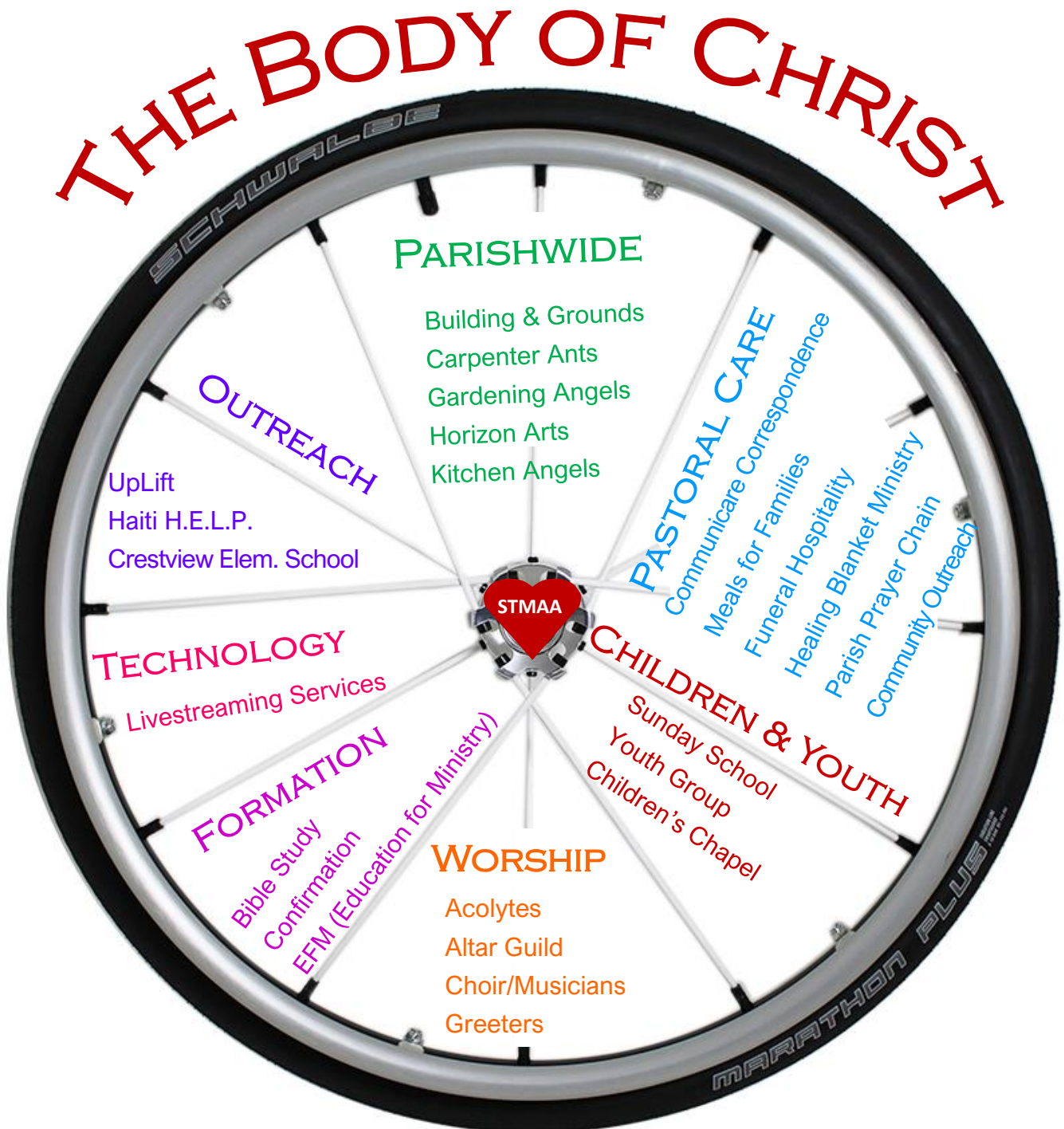

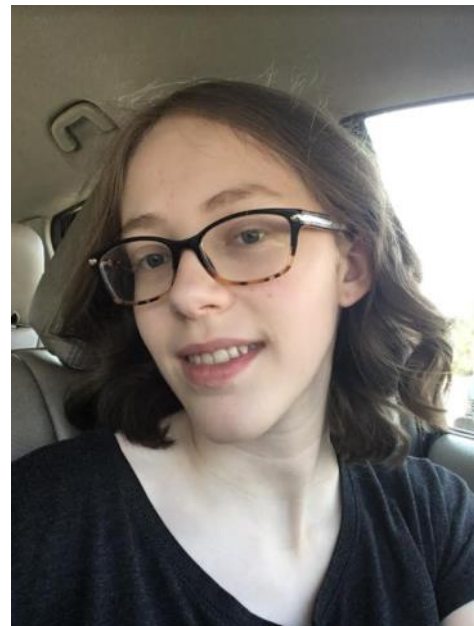
### **Gwyneth Hayes**
