- Conduct research to discover new knowledge that improves the quality of care and quality of life of children and families.



The Shriners are a 150-year old international fraternity defined by fun, fellowship and philanthropy, based on the Masonic principles of brotherly love, relief and truth.

Their philanthropy established Shriners Hospitals for Children in 1922.





OUR HISTORY



1930 MOVE TO PUNAHOU STREET

The Dowsett Family deeded the land on Punahou Street to the Shriners fraternity and the mansion was used as the first Shriners hospital

1923 SHRINERS OPENS IN HAWAII

Hawai'i is the second hospital in the system to open and was founded by the Shriners in 1923, opened as part of the rear wing of the Kauikeolani Children's Hospital in Liliha







2007 CONSTRUCTION OF CURRENT HOSPITAL BEGINS

Today's state of the art hospital began construction in 2007 and was completed in 2010

1967 GROUNDBREAKING FOR A NEW HOSPITAL

The mansion was demolished and replaced by a modernized hospital in 1970

OPPORTUNITIES FOR COLLABORATION



- Education
 - On Outreach trips (grand rounds, rounding, inclusion of residents/fellows)
 - Provider-to-Provider telehealth education and clinical support
 - Future Opportunities
 - Physical and Occupational Therapy



OPPORTUNITIES FOR COLLABORATION

- Research
 - Genomic and Precision Medicine Project
 - Identifies genetic causes of conditions seen in our patients through systemwide genomic database
 - Patients enrolled across all Shriners locations, including outreach sites in Guam, Saipan, Puerto Rico and Cyprus
 - Expansion planned in 2025 to include American Samoa, Palau and Yap with IRB approvals





ASKING YOUR KOKUA

- Contract or Memorandum of Agreement
- Physical Space
- Local Coordination
- Endorsement letter for each trip (~3 months in advance)
- Provider/Clinician Licensure &/or approval to practice medicine via endorsement letter
- Point of Contact / Communication assistance
- Telehealth
