

RMI Ministry of Health and Human Services Nurse Practitioner Intern Profiles



Primary Care Nurse Practitioners are advanced practice nurses who are taught to deliver preventive care and to diagnose and treat patients for common illnesses. They are considered a backbone of the primary care workforce in many countries including the US, Canada, Australia and others. In March 2018, 12 senior RMI Ministry of Health and Human Services (RMI MOHHS) nurses completed Fiji National University (FNU) College of Medicine, Nursing and Health Sciences Nurse Practitioner Training Program held at Majuro Hospital. This was a full-time, 18-month academic program leading to a post-graduate diploma in advanced practice nursing (primary care). The program was a partnership between the RMI MOHHS, FNU, and the Pacific Islands Health Officers' Association (PIHOA). The graduates have now entered a 12 month clinical internship, where they are receiving intensive hands-on primary care experience at Majuro Hospital. Dr. Aina Garstang of the medical staff of MOHHS is the Internship Coordinator and is overseeing instruction of the interns with the help of the MOHHS medical staff and volunteer medical tutors sponsored by PIHOA. The public will see a lot of the nurse practitioner interns and their preceptors as they proceed through internships. Below are the profiles of the intern class.

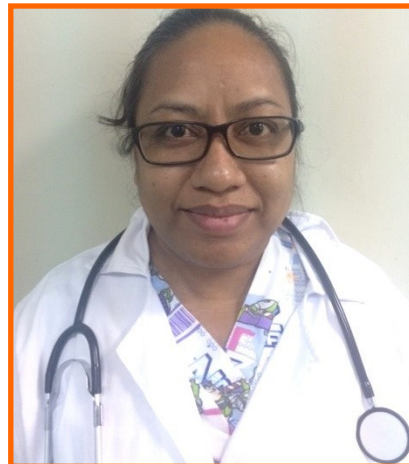

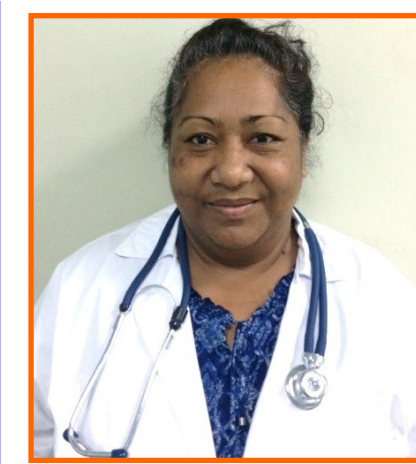

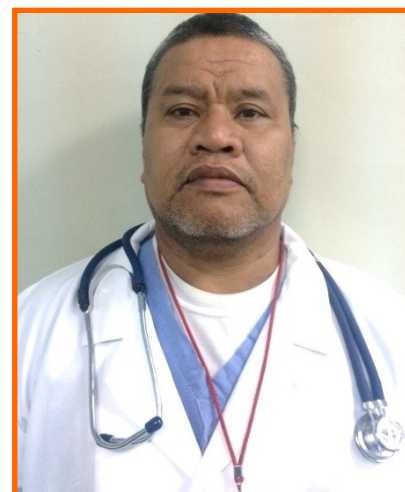
