Public-Use Data Files and Documentation

The National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) is pleased to offer downloadable public-use data files through the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) FTP file server. Users of this service have access to [data sets](#), [documentation](#), and [questionnaires](#) from NCHS surveys and data collection systems. Downloading instructions are available in "readme" files.

Public-use data files are prepared and disseminated to provide access to the full scope of the data. This allows researchers to manipulate the data in a format appropriate for their analyses. NCHS makes every effort to release data collected through its surveys and data systems in a timely manner.

Users of NCHS public-use data files must comply with [data use restrictions](#) to ensure that the information will be used solely for statistical analysis or reporting purposes.

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What are the challenges? And solutions? Examples?

- **Focus on Notifiable (reportable) conditions**
 - NEDSS = National Electronic Disease Surveillance System - standards driven - Jurisdiction system or CDC developed system-SaSS
 - NETSS - National Electronic Telecommunications System for Surveillance - one system, one approach, less flexibility
- Theories - challenges
 - Islands are reporting to CDC using NEDSS - data visibility
 - Islands are reporting to CDC using other than NEDSS, data is being accepted, but not published into national datasets
 - Islands are reporting to CDC using other than NEDSS, data is not being accepted.
 - Islands are not reporting

How can participating in NEDSS help my jurisdiction?

- Visibility, awareness, recognition
- Participation on the same level with States, standardized data collection tools
- Data included in public data files to Influence the appropriators in Congress (no lobbying by federal agencies) as well as other interested NGOs (who can lobby within reason)

How can I plan to implement NEDSS?

- Guam, CNMI - procurement, setup, implementation, incorporation
- Peer to peer technical assistance: Guam's time was influential for CNMI planning
- Discuss with NCHHSTP and ELC teams

Challenge to the PIHOA Board

1. Longer term: By Nov 2020, 4/6 USAPIs are 100% active on NEDSS; remaining 2 jurisdictions have a workplan to achieve active participation by March 2021
2. Shorter term: By March 2020, USAPIs work with NCHHSTP, NCEZID, and NCHS to resolve the inconsistencies with data accepting, reporting, publishing so as to inform a pathway to data visibility success for all USAPIs
