Rimrock Trails creates a foundation for healing, strengthens family connections, and offers hope for a brighter future.

Letter from the Executive Director

The year 2020 was a year like no other and the first half of 2021 proved to be just as relentless for Rimrock Trails. In the last year, we faced many difficulties and uncertainties including but not limited to chronic workforce shortages and a Covid-19 outbreak in our youth residential treatment program that required a temporary closure to allow for quarantine. Through it all, in true Rimrock Trails fashion, we came together, figured out what we needed to do, addressed each challenge that came our way, and found greater strength in our resolve. I couldn't be more proud of the organization, and I thank each and every one of you who contributes to us being the community that we are!



When COVID-19 closed down schools and businesses, our multidisciplinary team in the Residential Treatment Program continued to deliver around-the-clock care to Oregon's most at-risk youth. Across our clinic branches in Central Oregon, our 23 outpatient therapists, providers, and other professionals began delivering counseling services via telehealth to ensure continuity of care for our clients.

The behavioral health needs in our community have long gone under-addressed and underserved and the COVID-19 pandemic has exacerbated the issue. Today, one in four individuals experiences a mental illness or substance use disorder, and one in three report symptoms of anxiety. Access to care has never been more important and for those in recovery, this year proved especially difficult. Rimrock Trails' demand for outpatient counseling services increased nearly 300% over the last year. In order to meet the growing need and expand access to services we acquired a beautiful historic home in downtown Redmond and will celebrate the opening of services in the new larger location in September 2021! We also put extra effort into recruiting and hiring specially trained child and family providers in all of our locations. In addition, we are offering specialty supervision and training in child and family therapy for student interns to support the development of our local behavioral health workforce.

Despite the unexpected obstacles the last year presented, we persevered. We united as a community, turning setbacks into bigger leaps forward. I'm so thankful to all of our supporters, community partners, dedicated employees, volunteers, community engagement teams, and board members. I and am so proud of what we accomplished together. We quite literally couldn't have made it, without each and every one of you!

The Board of Directors, Leadership Team, and diversely skilled healthcare professionals at Rimrock Trails are dedicated to helping create lasting positive change in the lives of individuals and families. Here's how it all started!

In 1990, Rimrock Trails was established as a nonprofit adolescent residential substance use treatment program at the Pioneer Memorial Hospital.



In 1998, Rimrock Trails constructed a second building on the property to house outpatient services, administrative offices, classrooms, an indoor rock climbing wall, gym, and weight room. That same year they opened outpatient counseling clinics in Bend and Redmond.



In 2019, Rimrock Trails expanded its outpatient counseling programs to include mental health counseling services for persons of all ages in their Bend, Redmond, and Prineville clinics.

Today Rimrock Trails is a leader in the system of care for addressing mental health and substance use disorders for the most vulnerable children, teens, adults, and families in Central Oregon and is one of the longest standing behavioral health providers in the region.

Andrea's Story

The stigma surrounding mental illness has improved dramatically but there is still so much negativity and confusion about those of us who suffer from the disease. We need more positivity and support toward the mental health industry and I hope that by sharing my survivor's journey, more individuals will seek support from organizations like Rimrock Trails.



In 1986, I was an orphan by the age of 11. As you can imagine, that was beyond tough. I didn't

realize how much that word "Orphan" affected me and how I saw myself. I didn't belong in the normal "family" category anymore, I had a "guardian", not a "parent". I didn't have any sense of belonging or any attachment to anyone or anything other than my sister who was 14 and going through this journey with me. I hesitated to trust people because it seemed they always left me.


I mourned not only the loss of my parents, but I also mourned the "normal" everyday life that I once had. I wept often in the silence of my room, feeling the utter pain of sadness, grief, and debilitating depression. I felt abandoned by God and my parents. The loss was tangibly heartbreaking and painful; put simply, I ached for what I had lost. I suffered from depression and anxiety even back then but didn't recognize it or even understand the pain I was feeling. The stigma of mental illness was not accepted by anyone in my circle and seeking a therapist meant I was crazy, soft or weak minded. I didn't have the opportunity for treatment for my grief, loss, or depression and it wasn't ok to talk about it or have anyone know I was suffering or even needed help. I didn't know that it was ok to ask for help, so I didn't ask. The emotions were ignored, tucked away, and I silently suffered for years.

Years later, after experiencing infertility issues and treatments my amazing husband and I adopted our third child. Unfortunately, the treatments had taken their toll on me and shortly thereafter, I suffered physically having nearly hemorrhaged. Emotionally, I was a complete wreck. There were days when I could barely get out of bed to function as a wife and mother. I was often napping in the afternoons and went to bed when the kids did around 8 pm. I even remember when our youngest was in Kindergarten, I slept through my alarm and missed picking him up at the bus stop so my poor child had to wait on that bus until I could get to him.

I own those years of depression and anxiety. Facing shame, guilt, and sadness has taught me so much about my mental issues. No longer a victim of my past choices and circumstances, I now know, I am a survivor because of my circumstances. I have sought counseling and prescription medication from a licensed provider to help me with my depression and it has been lifechanging. I am better than ever before. I am happy, positive, and present as a wife, mother, and friend. I have a newfound faith in God and Jesus Christ that increases my positivity every day.

If you've never experienced depression or anxiety, please don't judge those like me. We often suffer in silence, beating ourselves up with negative selftalk and are hard on ourselves because of the guilt we feel for not being able to function normally. If you suffer from depression or anxiety or any mental health issue, please remember that you are not alone. No matter what you face, reach out for support from reputable and registered counseling clinics like Rimrock Trails. You are not alone and they are here to help!
