

Services Reopening Update During COVID-19

- COVID-19 Call Center has staff working remotely to answer questions from providers, businesses, and the public that cannot be handled by [CO-HELP](#). Contact Tri-County Health Department's COVID-19 Call Center by calling 303-220-9200 or emailing callcenter@tchd.org.
- [Women, Infants, and Children \(WIC\) services](#) and benefits are being processed for new and existing families by telephone.
- [Birth Control and Sexual Health Clinics](#) are open for appointments only. No walk-ins at this time.
- [Immunization Clinics](#) are offered by appointment in all regular clinic locations. We are still serving all ages, but no tuberculosis skin testing at this time.
 - The Aurora East and Westminster now offer “Park & Call” clinics - no appointment needed. This option is available from 8:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m. and 1 p.m. - 3:30 p.m. on Tuesdays/Thursdays in Aurora East, and Fridays in Westminster. Clients park in a designated spot upon arrival and call to check in. We ask that clients do not walk-in without speaking to a staff member first to complete a COVID-19 screening.
- [Vital Records](#) is open for issuing birth and death certificates.
- [Harm Reduction and HIV Prevention Program](#) continues to provide outreach services and HIV/Hepatitis C testing to people experiencing homelessness.
- [Environmental Health](#) staff continues to conduct inspections and provide COVID-19 guidance to food establishments, childcare facilities, septic systems, pools, and spas.
- [Medicaid and CHP+](#) enrollment support is provided to troubleshoot enrollment issues and update changes to household information.
- [Senior Dental Care](#) is available for low-income Arapahoe County residents ages 55 and older who do not have dental insurance. Fees are on a sliding scale, based on income.
