

Who Needs to Quarantine?

For students, teachers, and staff outside the school and child care setting

Exposed to a probable or confirmed case of COVID-19 who had

- A positive COVID-19 viral test, even if later tests are negative, Or
- Any major, or two or more minor symptoms after a recent exposure to COVID-19 (but has not had a negative test while symptomatic)

Where Did The Exposure Occur?

Was the exposed person a household contact?

- Within 6 ft for >15 minutes, Or
- Lives in the same household as the ill person, Or
- Sleeps in the same space as ill person, Or
- Had any direct physical contact with a case for any duration such as tackling, hugging, diapering, feeding, or sneezed/coughed on

YES

Was the person exposed outside of the home?

- Participated in club sports or other activities outside of the school setting where there was close contact within 6 ft for >15 minutes or forms of other close contact, such as:
 - Sharing of water bottles or equipment, assisted stretching, post game celebrations
 - Direct physical contact

Does the exposed person meet any of these criteria?

- Is aged 5-11 years and has completed the primary COVID-19 vaccine series at least 14 days prior to exposure, Or
- Is aged 12+ years and is up-to-date on all recommended COVID-19 vaccine doses (including a booster dose if 5+ months after mRNA vaccines or 2+ months after Johnson&Johnson vaccine), Or
- Had a positive COVID-19 test (PCR or antigen or at-home test) in past 90 days, Or

Quarantine Required

- Stay home through 5 days after exposure⁽¹⁾
- Watch for symptoms for 10 days
- Get tested about 3-5 days after exposure
- If no symptoms, person may return to school on Day 6 and should properly wear a mask in school settings
- Avoid participating in extracurricular activities where masking is inconsistent
- If symptoms develop, isolate from others and get tested

Remain in School

- Watch for symptoms for 10 days
- Get tested about 3-5 days after exposure
- Properly wear a mask in school settings if aged 2+ years
- If symptoms develop, isolate from others and get tested

1. The date of your exposure is considered day 0. Day 1 is the first full day after your last contact with a person who has had COVID-19.
