That money will supplement the ENF grant for use with bags for underserved mothers and their newborn babies administered through Happi Clinic, and we also still need newborn diapers! We are already in preparation for the 30lb food packs for underserved school children so they may have nourishment during Christmas break. We have reestablished a working relationship with Tut Fann State Veterans Home and are excited to work with them and Madison County Veterans Court, where 24 backpacks of nourishment and necessities were delivered through the Redstone Sergeant Majors Association. Once the items are received, we will need volunteers to assemble and deliver. There will be two separate assembly and delivery for HLC due to the long lead time of some items. First assembly and delivery will be TBD (within 2 weeks).
- Gratitude Grant: we are waiting on final numbers from both Buckhorn and Morris on the number of students in need for Christmas break backpacks. Once the number is established, we will begin price comparisons etc. Goal is to have the bags packed on December 3rd at the Lodge at 5:00pm. Delivery to the two schools will be determined by each school before Christmas break.
