

November Message from the ER

The vote by the membership was to go non-smoking with two amendments made. One to define smoking as all tobacco and vaping materials and products. The second amendment made by Buzzy Byrom was that 120 days after the approval by Grand Lodge and the implementation of the by-law change, Bingo income projections were not \$46,000.00 a year or more, Bingo would revert back to being smoking. This motion will not become active until it is approved by Grand Lodge. I have heard that there are those who were not happy with how the vote was handled. The only response that I have is that the notice was given in the newsletter to the membership, including the date and it was published multiple times in the newsletter. The newsletter is provided to the membership for things of this nature as well as being in the Lodge and on the bulletin board.
