SUMMARY OF SERVICES

Camp Shana Tova Childcare and Youth Programming

For the children's safety, we require ALL children to be preregistered for attendance at High Holy Day children's and youth programs, whether or not they are enrolled in our school, whether or not their parents or grandparents are TBI members. If you have not already registered your child(ren), please use the High Holy Day Attendance Plan 2019 form, also available on our home page, www.tbibluebell.org.

6 months—4 years

Age-appropriate childcare and activities. Includes Young Families Service; parents attend service with their child(ren). Young Families Service open to TBI members and their guests, and pre-registered non-member guests. For all children in this age group, please complete the Camp Shana Tova Supplemental Information form.

Kindergarten—2nd

Age-appropriate activities. Includes Family Service; parents welcome to attend but not required. K—2nd programming and Family Service open to TBI members registered in Religious School, and to TBI Young Families (whether or not they are members of the synagogue).

Grades 3—7

Age-appropriate activities and Junior Congregation. Students have the option to attend Main Service with their parent(s). Open to TBI members registered in Religious School, and their registered guests.

Grades 8—12

Age-appropriate activities. Includes Teen Service and time in Main Service. Open to TBI members and their registered guests only. Teens will be seated in auditorium open seating unless family purchases reserved seat in overflow or sanctuary

Main Service

Tickets are issued for everyone, TBI members and their guests, age 13 and older, to be presented on request when entering services. There is no charge to TBI members for open seating in the auditorium, or for auditorium handicapped reserved. Please see Schedule of Dues and Fees for other ticket prices (reserved seats and guests).

TICKETS FOR SERVICES

We will be checking tickets at services. *Please bring your own ticket — they are not transferable — and be prepared to show it upon request. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter. Tickets are issued for adults, and for all students who have become bar or bat mitzvah.*

PARKING AND BUS SERVICE

Please park in the TBI lot or in the Kohls/McCaffrey's parking lot at DeKalb and Skippack Pike. We strongly encourage you not to park along Skippack Pike, especially after dark on Kol Nidre. It is dangerous. We provide continuous shuttle service on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur mornings from 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. and on Kol Nidre from 5:30 to 9:30 p.m. If the TBI lot is full when you arrive, please drive to the Kohls/McCaffrey's parking lot. Park in the area closest to Skippack Pike, not adjacent to the store entrances. A shuttle will be waiting to drive you back to TBI. When you leave the synagogue, a shuttle will be available to drive you back to your car. Please use this service so we will all have a safe and joyous New Year.

HEARING AND VISUALLY IMPAIRED

We have a limited number of both hearing devices and large print High Holy Day Mahzorim, which you may reserve on a first-come, first-served basis by calling the synagogue office. Sign language interpretation will be available at times listed on the obverse page.

CREATING A PEACEFUL PRAYER SPACE

Be sure that your mobile device is off, or if absolutely necessary, set to vibrate only. Cell phones may not be used anywhere in the building during High Holy Days. In an emergency please exit the building before returning a call.

So that everyone can fully enjoy High Holy Day services, please help our ushers to control the noise level as congregants enter and exit the Sanctuary and Auditorium while services are in progress. Please assist us by entering quietly and quickly, following the ushers' direction.

Please observe the Quiet Zones around the entrances to services. We invite you to exchange social greetings and holiday best wishes before or after services. We thank you sincerely for your cooperation.

Nursing mothers are encouraged to feed their infants wherever they feel comfortable. For privacy, you may wish to use the Bride's Room (opposite the Courtyard).

PERSONAL FRAGRANCE

We make this special request for the comfort of everyone, especially those with asthma, allergies, and other sensitivities: Please refrain from using personal scent such as perfume, after-shave and scented hair products when you come to services. Thank you for your consideration of others.
