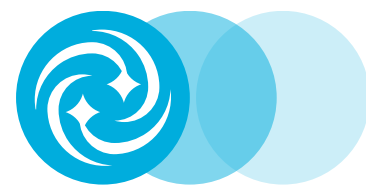

- **Founded in 2005 and serving Nevada communities for 20 years.**

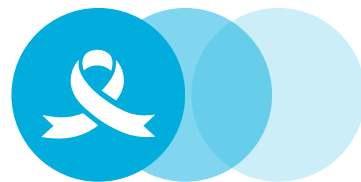


Peer-based recovery sustainment services

Employer education and employment services

Structured vocational program for members who are unemployed and looking for work. The recovery works program works to provide training and advising for Nevada employers becoming designated as Recovery Friendly Workplaces.

Recovery Housing with employment services

Six month housing program for male members of the clubhouse who've enrolled in the Recovery Works program.



Access Center

Member enrollment and resource navigation

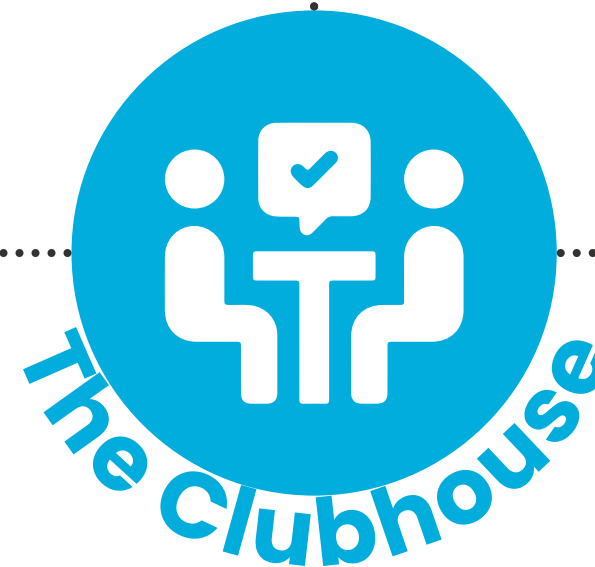

Recovery Coach Training & Internship Program

Empowering members to support others & run the Clubhouse

Subsidized 46-hour state certification training program for members of the clubhouse to facilitate member circles, run the coffee shop, and assist with outreach, member check-ins, trainings, and clubhouse activities.



Transportation

No-cost transportation provided to members through the Recovery Shuttle service and bus cards.



Food Security

Meals served daily at member circles. Members also have access to a small food bank at the clubhouse and free coffee.



Amenities

Members have access to computers, lounges, library, WiFi, TV, movies, and video games.



Meetings, Workshops, Clubs, & Socials

Inclusive access to workshops, clubs, & social events for members. (Yoga, art classes, garden club, trainings, etc.)



Clothing

On-site laundry and vouchers for clothing at the Secondhand Serenity store.



Overdose Prevention Monthly Trainings

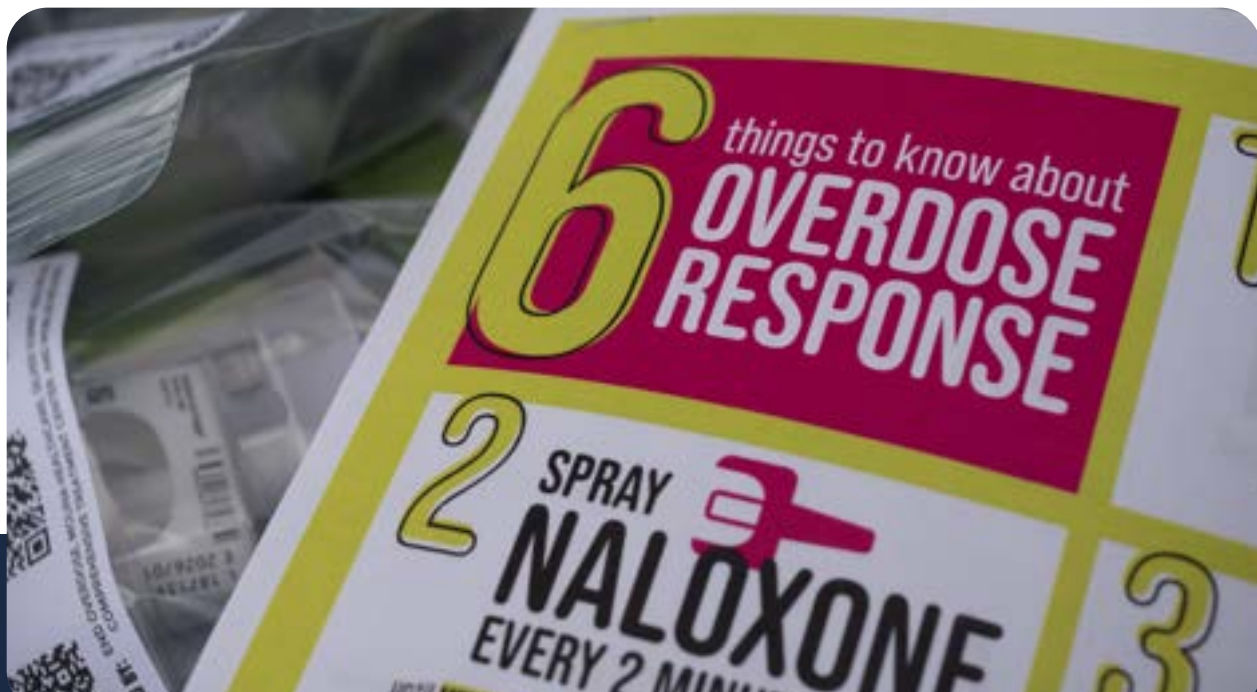
In-person training to teach individuals how to recognize signs of opioid overdose and administer Naloxone



This one hour, in-person training will teach individuals how to recognize signs of opioid overdose and respond to the situation, including administering the life-saving medication Naloxone. Naloxone (brand name Narcan) reverses the effects of an opioid overdose and all attendees will leave equipped with an overdose kit that contains either nasal or intramuscular Naloxone.

Community Canvasser Initiative

Inspired by other successful public health and community organizing campaigns, the Community Canvasser Initiative has recruited paid canvassers to go door-to-door in neighborhoods throughout Clark County, raising awareness about the overdose crisis, educating residents on how to recognize and respond to an overdose, and distributing the life-saving medication naloxone. Our goal is to knock on 100,000 doors per year. Canvassers are targeting areas of Clark County with the highest rates of overdoses to connect residents with resources, tools, and education.



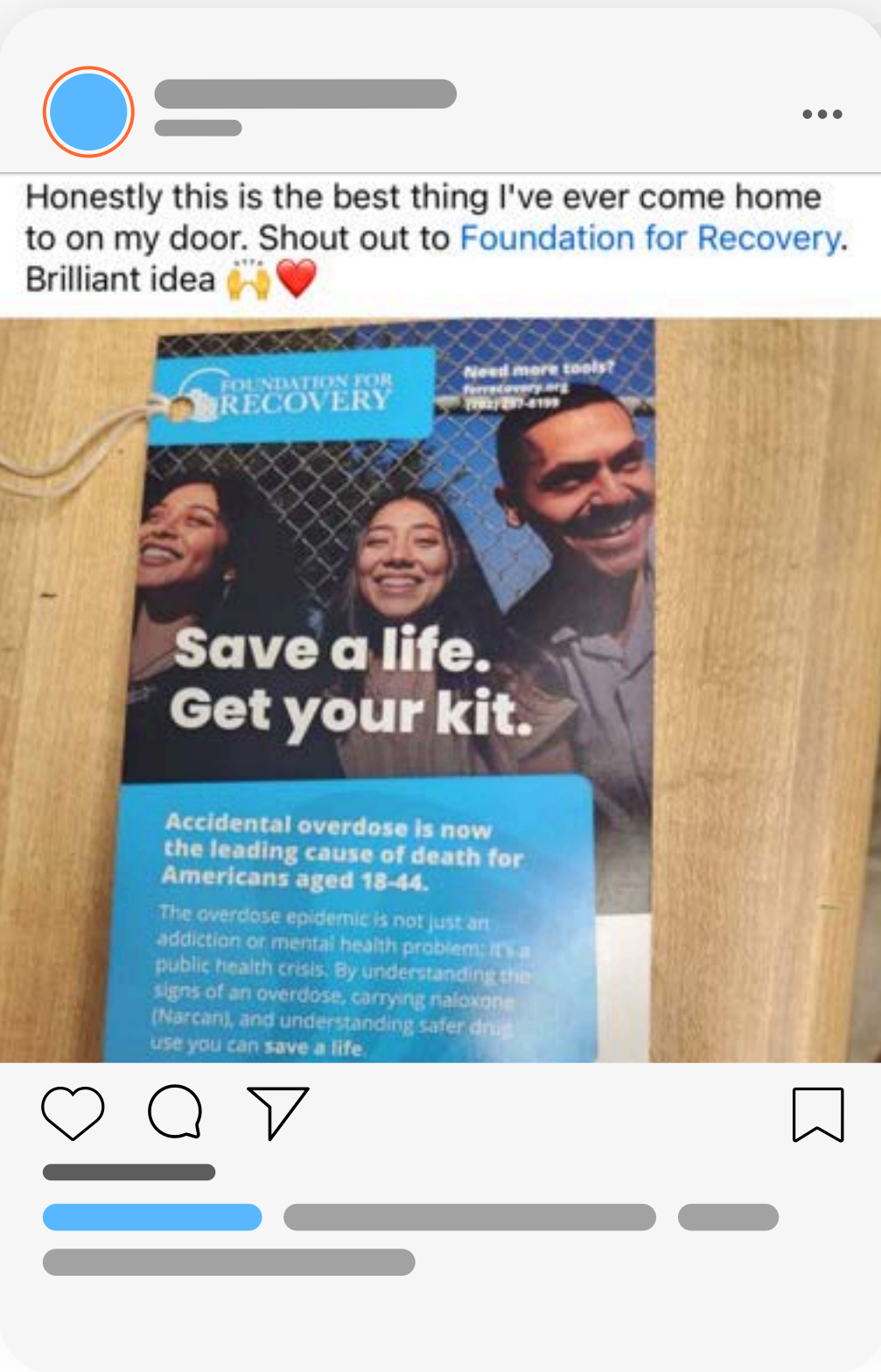
Engagements

- ▶ Interactions: 33,772
- ▶ All Time Doors Knocked: 29,842
- ▶ Conversation Rate: 19%

Distribution

- ▶ Naloxone Doses: 8,290
- ▶ Fentanyl Test Strips: 13,485
- ▶ Xylazine Test Strips: 13,485





What is our why?

- ▶ Majority of overdose deaths in Clark County are occurring in a home setting.
- ▶ 68% of decedents in 2022 had at least one potential opportunity for linkage to care prior to death or implementation of a life-saving action at the time of overdose
 - ▶ And in the case of nearly 45% of deaths there was a bystander present.
- ▶ Beyond preventing overdose deaths, having conversations with our neighbors can help to breakdown misconceptions, stigma, and increase awareness of public behavioral health resources.

Medicaid Billing Code for Peers

What is the legal definition of PRSS?

- NV Revised Statutes § 433.626: Peer Support Services are defined as non-clinical supportive services that used lived experience in recovery to promote recovery
- Nevada Revised Statutes § 449.01566: Peer Support Services may include mentoring, assisting in resource navigation, assisting in stabilization
- As an overview, peer services are evidence based support services delivered by individuals in recovery that help others develop the skills and community connections they need to find wellness

Current Provider Types

- There are other provider types that have been used for peer support (such as 14-302 or 82-302)
 - PT 14: Traditionally used for Qualified Behavioral Aides in behavioral health outpatient settings
 - PT 82: Used in BH treatment
 - PT 93: SUD treatment
- As of July 2025, the new provider type for peer services is 97
 - 706: PRSS
 - 720: Youth PRSS
 - 899: Family PRSS
- The state may continue to allow providers to bill under old PT's until they have completed their transition; regularly check your billing guide during this transition period
