The show will be held Saturday, October 8 (10 a.m. to 5 p.m.) and Sunday, October 9 (11 a.m. to 4 p.m.) at the [Doubletree Hotel San Jose](#). Tickets are \$7 for teens and adults, \$5 for seniors (62+), and \$3 for kids (5-12). You can park all day for \$12 with a show-validated ticket, or take a pleasant, [ten-minute walk](#) from VTA's [Metro/Airport light rail stop](#). Wheeled bags and infant strollers must be checked at the show.
