Planning Partners

- Provide information on hiring standards and processes of your company
- Provide information for relevant labor market information by responding to periodic surveys of needs, job vacancies, and job application processes to assist schools and students with career and academic planning
- Partner with education, economic development, and workforce development organizations in the region on grant applications to bring needed workforce resources to Northwest Indiana

Communication Partners

- Participate in career fairs, speaking engagements, and other showcases
- Host or serve as a sponsor for a career awareness event
- Visit a K-12 school and discuss your industry or host a student or counselor/teacher field trip to your company
- Provide information about your company's apprenticeship programs, tuition reimbursement plans, company training programs or other learning experience at regional college and career events

Training and Education Partners

- Identify candidates among your own staff who would benefit from acquiring new credentials or completing college, and support their efforts through tuition reimbursement, time off, or other means
- Ask job applicants for specific credentials endorsed by the NWIWB and tested with employees (WorkKeys, National Career Readiness Certification, Work Ethics Certification, and Expanded High School Transcript)
- Provide a short term, first work experience for a high school student in a safe environment
- Provide internships, try-out employment, part-time jobs and on-the-job training opportunities
