First UCC Council Meeting Minutes — November 21, 2022, 6:30 pm, Beil Hall

Members Present: Barb Babler, Jayne Campbell, Kathryn Fox, Connie Geier, Shawn Gratz, Stacy Heller, Shawn Kippley, Rodger Goke, Pastor Laura

Call to Order: Meeting called to order by Jayne Campbell, President.

Pastor Laura led devotions with a prayer by Diana Butler Bass entitled, “Choose Gratitude”.

Treasurer’s Report: A motion was made to accept the treasurer’s report and pay bills as funds are available by Stacy and seconded by Connie. Motion Carried.

Consent Agenda: A motion was made to accept the Consent Agenda by Stacy and seconded by Connie. Motion carried.

Discussion Agenda: There was discussion around using the Carillon again at special services. There will need to be some research into the programming.

Pastor’s Report: Discussion centered around the service times for Christmas Eve. We also reviewed the current process for preparing and serving Communion. The present arrangement with bread and plastic serving cups in baggies will be used through the rest of this year – may change in the coming New Year.

The Gift Acceptance Policy was presented and followed by discussion. Motion to adopt the Gift Acceptance Policy was made by Kathryn and seconded by Connie. Motion carried.

An undesignated gift of stock valued at \$5,000 has been accepted. A motion to place the funds in the Endowment Fund was made by Barb and seconded by Rodger. Motion carried.

Charges of \$75 for members using the First UCC building for personal or family events will be waived on a motion by Connie; seconded by Kathryn. Motion Carried.

The Council representative for ushering in January will be Kathryn. Usher for December 25 will be Sandy and for Jan. 1 will be Stacy and Rodger.

The Health and Safety Committee recommends that the front door remain locked during worship and an usher will watch the door for those arriving after the service has begun. We will continue with 3 ushers, one of which will remain at the front entry.

A motion to adjourn was made by Connie and seconded by Stacy. Meeting was adjourned and ended with the Lord’s Prayer.
