Conference description: Welcome to the Fifteenth Annual HIV in West Virginia Conference. The past, present and future of HIV will be presented and your host is the MidAtlantic AIDS Education and Training Centers: WV Regional Partner. This conference intends to inform participants on issues relative to the past, present and future of HIV/AIDS. The conference offers a dynamic course agenda with expert faculty speaking on clinically and socially relevant issues to include but not limited to Treatment as Prevention, HIV Criminalization and Anxiety in the Context of HIV. 6. Discuss the impact of on-going HIV criminalization on stigma, engagement and retention in care for persons living with HIV.
