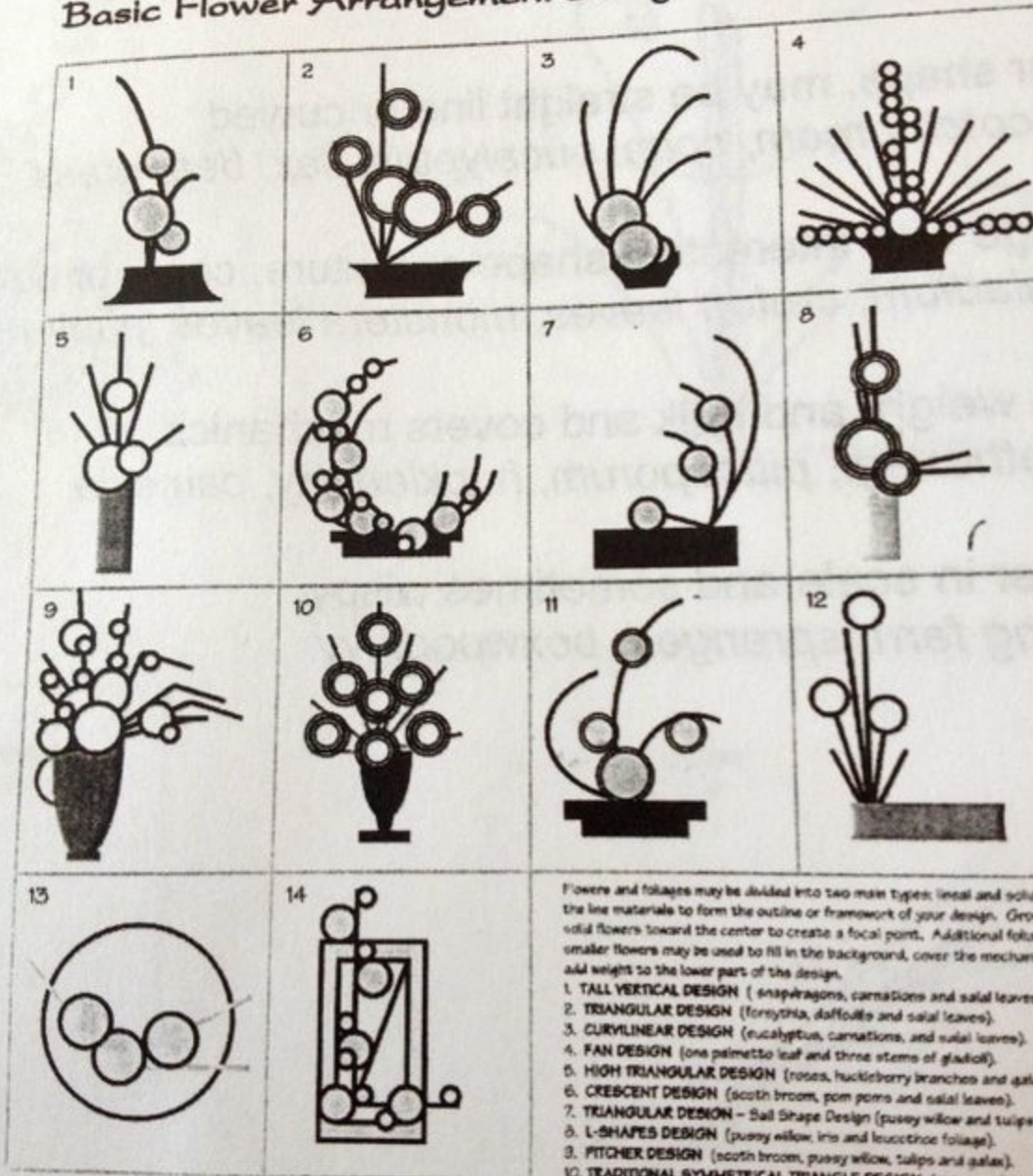


## Basic Flower Arrangement Designs



Flowers and foliage may be divided into two main types: lineal and solid. Use the line materials to form the outline or framework of your design. Group solid flowers toward the center to create a focal point. Additional foliage and smaller flowers may be used to fill in the background, cover the mechanics, and add weight to the lower part of the design.

1. TALL VERTICAL DESIGN (snapdragons, carnations and salal leaves)
2. TRIANGULAR DESIGN (forsythia, daffodils and salal leaves)
3. CURVILINEAR DESIGN (eucalyptus, carnations, and salal leaves)
4. FAN DESIGN (one palmetto leaf and three stems of gladiol)
5. HIGH TRIANGULAR DESIGN (roses, huckleberry branches and galax)
6. CRESCENT DESIGN (scotch broom, pom poms and salal leaves)
7. TRIANGULAR DESIGN - Ball Shape Design (pussy willow and tulips)
8. L-SHAPE DESIGN (pussy willow, iris and leucotoe foliage)
9. PITCHER DESIGN (scotch broom, pussy willow, tulips and galax)
10. TRADITIONAL SYMMETRICAL TRIANGLE DESIGN (roses and juniper)
11. THREE LINE DESIGN (forced cherry branches, iris and galax leaves)
12. NATURALISTIC DESIGN (3 clutch iris, baker fern, and moss)
13. TOP VIEW CRESCENT TABLE DESIGN (carnations and baker fern)
14. TOP VIEW TRIANGULAR TABLE DESIGN (gladiol and salal leaves)
