**Support with navigation** of complex systems. **Case management is the foundation of all other services.**



**Find medical care people need** and support that leads to **increased health and safety monitoring.**

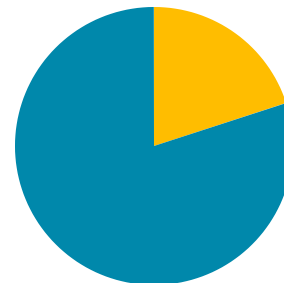


**Build a supportive team** built on trusted relationships that are created with a **reasonable caseload size.**



**Provide help in setting goals** that fulfills Oregon's **legal and moral obligations** to individuals with disabilities and their families.

"Currently, the state funds case management entities at about 80% to hire and train effective case managers."



## Current Case Management:



The 2019-2021 budget does not keep pace with **workforce demands, increasing caseloads, or system regulations.**



On average, we are funding **3 case managers for every 4** that are needed.



A state investment of \$5 million will bring in about \$6 million in additional Federal funding for 2020-2021 to meet the continuing service level.
