

Fully Fund Case Management Entities

Oregon is strongest when all people have the supports they need to be successful. Quality case management services for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) is essential to helping people to receive the supports they need to live rich, full lives in their local communities.

"Fully funding Case Management Entities will improve the life, safety, dignity and well-being of people with IDD and their families"



On average, we are funding **3 case managers for every 4** that are needed.

How does our funding work?

Each biennium, ODHS creates a Workload Model showing how much it would cost if the state itself provided DD case management. The Legislature then decides what percentage of that cost it will provide to the CDDPs and Brokerages who do the work.



What are the benefits of investing in case management entities?



More employment supports

that help people prepare, look for, and keep a **community job**.



Support with navigation

of complex systems. **Case management is the foundation of all other services.**



Access to the right medical supports

and mental health services that leads to **increased health and safety monitoring.**



Assistance during times of crisis

to interact successfully with law enforcement, hospitals and **other community resources.**



Provide help in setting goals

that fulfills Oregon's **legal and moral obligations** to individuals with disabilities and their families.

Fully funding case management means:

Currently funded just under 74% of what the state estimates it should cost, **a return to 95% of the DD workload model** for operational costs and **100% of the workload model** for staffing is needed to meet needs.
