

The Equal Justice Initiative's Lynching Marker Project

At 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, September 7th, a historical marker will be unveiled on Calvert Street in Annapolis (across from the Arundel Center) as part of the Equal Justice Initiative's Lynching Marker Project. In an effort to bring remembrance, reconciliation, and education about these painful events, Connecting the Dots has partnered with the Equal Justice Initiative, the Maryland Lynching Memorial Project, the City of Annapolis, Anne Arundel County, local elected officials and civil rights groups to bring the first historical marker to Maryland, acknowledging racial terror.

Parking is available in the Whitmore Garage at 37 Clay Street. Consider bringing a lawn chair if you will require seating during the unveiling ceremony.

Following the unveiling ceremony, Connecting the Dots and their partners will offer an open opportunity for the public to address the topic: "Who are we and where are we going as a Nation?" All are welcome.
